## TELEGRAPHIC

GOLDFIELD, May 31.—A rush is on to the new district near Alkali Springs and this city is being depopulated. The strike appears to be seven miles long and three wide and this is the third day of the rush.

TACOMA, May 31.—Four highway-men entered a saloon at Kennewick, Washington last night and held up the occupants for \$1300. Nobody hurt.

SEATTLE, May 31.—Elsie Mullhof, an eleven year old girl was assaulted and murdered by a fifteen year old boy named Tom Nellingham of Renton yesterday. The boy is in jail.

DUBLIN, May 31.—Michael Davitt, the great Irish leader, died here last night of blood poisoning, following an operation for mastoiditis performed some time ago. The city will go in mourning.

MADRID, May 31.—On the eve of his wedding, King Alfonso has received the American minister with congratulations. Princess Ena of Battenberg, bride elect is here, and all preparations are being completed for the notable ceremony.

BORJAN, Russia, May 31.—Nihilists almost killed Gen. Alikhanoff yesterday as he was boarding the train for Tiflis. A bomb was thrown and several were injured.

GOLCONDA, May 31.—Another name has been added to the list of dead from the flood in Pale Creek canyon. The body of an unknown man was found in the debris and has been handed over to the coroner.

RENO, May 31.—A man named Schmitz was held up and robbed in broad daylight, Wednesday. He went looking for the pair that robbed him, met one, as he supposed, accosted him and was knocked down for his pains. No arrests and no recovery of the money Schmitz lost.

NEW YORK, May 31.—The talk of the sporting world is the sensational winning by Harry Payne Whitney's colt "Burgomaster," of the rich Belmont stakes, Wednesday afternoon. The stake was of the value of \$25,000. Burgomaster, opened at 1 to 2, was pounded to 2 to 5, took the lead at the first quarter and came in on the bit.

LOS ANGELES, May 31.—Joe Egan will leave here shortly for Nevada to remain. The little manager has acquired some caims in Fairview and with his partner will go there to stay.

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th day of Sept., 1905, in accordance with Section 23, Chapter XLVI, of the Statutes of 1905, one Philip V. Migheis and Frank L. Wildes of Carson, County of Ormsby and State of Nevada, made application to the State Engineer of Nevada for permission to appropriate the public waters of the State of Nevada. Such application to be made from Ash Canyon creek at points in NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 of section 10 T 15 N R 19 E by means of a dam and headgate and five cubic feet per second is to be conveyed to points in NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 of section 11, T 15 N R 19 E, by means of a flume and pipe and there used to generate electrical power. The construction of said works shall begin before June 1, 1906, and shall be completed on or before June 1, 1907. The water shall be actually applied to a beneficial use on or before June 1, 1908.
