**SOME LAW FOR LEASERS**

The Mining and Scientific Press says: The lessee of a mine has a right to all of value that may be created by his mining operations, unless the lease stipulates otherwise, but the right ceases upon the termination of his lease. Where tailing or dump-rock is left on the land of another his detritus of mining operations becomes the property of the landowner, who may convert it to his own use if he so desires, or he may sue the owner of the mine or mill producing it for damage, if any result to him.
