

### Democratic and Silver Party Nominees and Platform

Following are the nominees and the platform adopted by the Democratic and Silver parties in convention Sept. 25. The nominees are the best men in the county for their respective places they seek and the platform reiterates the fact that only in the democratic party can officers be found that will serve honestly and justly when elected.

It is recommended to the serious consideration of the voters of Ormsby the belief that they will repudiate specious arguments of the opposition to induce them to forsake their best interests and vote for other than the nominees mentioned hereunder.

#### THE PLATFORM

The following platform was adopted by both conventions and it tells the story in concise language. After the usual preamble, reporting the action of the committee, the platform reads as follows:

1. That this convention endorses the people's cause and the champion of the Common People, William Jennings Bryan, as the presidential nominee of the National Democratic Convention in 1908.
2. That we endorse and conservative and economical administration of the present Board of Fusion County Commissioners who centralized the wasteful extravagance of the previous republican administration by running a county of twenty-one townships on a business basis during the past two years. We pledge the good faith of this party to a continuance of an administration which will be for the best interests of the people and we congratulate the tax payers of Ormsby that their financial affairs were in such a good flourishing condition that they were able to bond the county for the erection of a new school building which cost \$25,000.
3. We heartily endorse and commend the senatorial record of the Hon. Francis G. Newlands. As "Father of the Irrigation Bill" he is entitled to the gratitude of every loyal Nevadan. His broad statesmanship as illustrated in his action on the Railroad Rate Regulation Bill and other measures of great national importance gave Nevada a unique distinction in the United States Senate. We pledge our nominee to the state senate to support the nominee of the Democratic Silver caucus for United States Senator in 1908.
4. That we congratulate the people of the country of the continued appreciation in the price of silver, holding that this fact shatters the contention of those traitors to the state who held that the white metal would soon become so plentiful as to render it valueless as money. That the advance in price has enabled the miners of Nevada to reopen many properties which were closed during the time when the republicans hammered down the price of the chief product of the state and closed the United States Mint in this city as a sacrifice to party fealty at the expense of state progress and we ask them, in view of the present flourishing condition of the state, if they would not be willing to share in the prosperity which would come to the Commonwealth of Nevada if silver were again restored to its rightful place as a money metal.
5. That we hold all property, whether owned by the rich or poor is alike before the law for the purposes of taxation and should be treated accordingly.
6. That we heartily endorse the able state administration of the fusion party during the past four years and pledge ourselves to support the regular nominees of the Fusion Convention held in Reno, August 29th, and also the regular nominees of this convention, as unity and harmony can alone point the way to victory in November.
