Primary Elections.

AT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE

Ormsby County Democratic Central Committee, an

election for Delegates to the State and County Conventions

was ordered to take place on the

14th day of September, 1878,

at the Curry Engine House, Carson City, Nevada, to elect

Delegates for both the State and County Democratic Con-

ventions. They also apportioned the number of said De-

legates to the several precincts, as follows:

STATE DEMOCRATIC CONVENTION.

Carson City Precinct..... 6 Delegates

Empire City Precinct..... 1 Delegate

Brunswick Mill Precinct..... 1 Delegate

ORMSBY COUNTY CONVENTION.

Carson City Precinct..... 16 Delegates

Empire City Precinct..... 5 Delegates

Brunswick Mill Precinct..... 2 Delegates

The Polls for the above Primary Elections are ordered to

open at 11 o'clock A. M., and close at 7 o'clock P. M. of

the same day.

All legal voters who can answer in the affirmative to the

following test will be eligible to vote at both named Prim-

aries:

1. Are you a citizen of the United States?

2. Will you have been in the State six months and in the

county thirty days next preceding the 6th of November,

1878?

3. Did you vote for the Tilden and Hendricks Electors at

the last Presidential election? If not, would you have

done so if you had the opportunity?

4. Do you pledge yourself to vote for the nominees of

the Democratic tickets at the next ensuing elections?

It was further ordered that, all arrangements for these

Primarys, as far as the Empire City and Brunswick Mill

precincts are concerned, shall be left to

Messrs. Freeman and Ambrose, members of the committee,

residing at Empire City, and they are hereby authorized

and empowered to call elections for the same, to take place

on the day and month above stated.

Democratic candidates for Delegates to either of the

above elections are hereby requested to make up tickets

for the same without further notice.

The following named gentlemen were duly elected to act

as officers at both elections: Judges—J. M. Eacker and

J. C. Ogden; Inspector—M. A. Driesbach; Clerk—O. H.

Gilbert.
