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ORDINANCE NO. 48.

An Ordinance to abolish Opium-smoking dens. The Board of Trustees of Carson City do ordain: Section 1. No person or persons shall, within the limits of Carson City, keep or maintain, or become an inmate of, or visit or contribute to, the support of any place, house, or room, where persons frequent, or assemble, for the purpose of smoking opium, and all such places, houses or rooms are hereby declared to be nuisances.

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BY VIRTUE OF A DECREE AND ORDER OF SAID

Justice of the Peace and under the Seal of the Hon. Second Judicial District Court in and for the County of Ormsby, State of Nevada, on a Judgment obtained therein on the 21st day of December, A. Byrne, for the principal sum of four hundred and eighty dollars and fifty cents, and the sum of fifty-nine dollars and sixty cents interest thereon accrued to date, and interest on said principal sum from date of said Judgment until paid at the rate of 2 per cent per month, and counsel fees in the sum of forty-seven dollars, and costs of suit in the sum of eleven dollars, all in gold coin of the United States; to be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the real property set out in said decree and order of sale, to satisfy the above demands, and in pursuance thereof to be levied upon and will exposed at public auction, in front of the Court House door in Carson City, Ormsby County, State of Nevada, on MONDAY, THE THIRTIETH DAY OF APRIL, A.
