AT A MEETING OF THE REPUBLICAN STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF Nevada, held at Virginia City, February 23, 1880, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the basis of representation in said Convention shall be one vote for every 100 votes, or fraction of 50 or over 50, cast at the last general election for the Republican State ticket, to-wit: Churchill, 1; Lincoln, 4; Douglas, 3; Lyon, 4; Elko, 4; Esmeralda, 5; Ormsby, 6; Esmeralda, 11; Storey, 31; Humboldt, 5; Washoe, 8; Lander, 5; White Pine, 5.

Resolved, That the following test be required of each and every voter at the Primary Elections: That he supported the Republican State ticket at the last general election, or would have done so had he voted, and a pledge to support the nominees of the Chicago National Convention.
