REPUBLICAN STATE CONVENTION.

AT A MEETING OF THE REPUBLICAN

STATE CENTRAL COMMITTEE of Nevada, held at Virginia City, February 23, 1880, the following resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That the Republican State Central Committee of the State of Nevada order that a State Convention be held at Austin, Lander County, in this State, on TUESDAY, MAY ELEVENTH, 1880, at the hour of 11 o'clock A. M. of said day, for the purpose of electing six delegates and six alternates, to represent the Republican party of Nevada in the National Republican Convention, to be held at Chicago, Illinois, June 2, 1880.

Resolved, That the basis of representation in said Convention shall be one vote for every 100 votes, or fraction of 50 or over 50, cast at the last general election for the Republican State ticket, to-wit:

Resolved, That the following test be required of each and every voter at the Primary Elections: That he supported the Republican State ticket at the last general election, or would have done so had he voted, and a pledge to support the nominees of the Chicago National Convention.
