....The Danish Arctic Expedition has started for Greenland for the purpose of exploring that country.

....Dr. Carver and an Englishman named W. Graham are matched to kill pigeons for \$5,000 a side. Time and place are not yet fixed.


....A fire yesterday morning at Bailey's Harbor, Wis., destroyed William Jackson's residence and his daughter, aged seven and twelve years, were burned to death.

....At Denton, Md., yesterday, the jury in the trial of Mrs. Beachamp for the murder of her husband returned a verdict of not guilty. James Abern indicted as accessory, was acquitted by order of the court.

....The Western Union Telegraph Company and Telephone Exchange at Quincy, Ill., was struck by lightning at an early hour yesterday morning. The upper story and roof were badly burned, but the damage will not exceed \$5,000.

....Algernon Victoria, a son-in-law of General Grant, arrived in New York from England on Sunday, and left today for the West on a pleasure trip as far as California. He arrived alone and left for the West unaccompanied. In the Fall he will return to England.

....Early this morning, W. E. Slaty, a member of the City Council of Vincennes, Ind., committed suicide by shooting himself. He fired two shots, both taking effect near the right temple. He had been Mayor for six years, and was a candidate at the election yesterday, but was defeated. It is believed his defeat at the polls prompted the act.
