BUTLER.

An incredible story comes from the East, to the effect that Ben Butler of Massachusetts is preparing to run for Mayor of New York City. The story goes, that while in Chicago Butler and John Kelly had an interview, which led them to pool their sorrows and disappointments. The two were old friends, and Butler was really anxious to administer consolation, and to this end suggested the idea of going to New York, and by the aid and influence of Tammany become a candidate for the Mayoralty of the metropolis. The persons who make the assertion that this improbable story is true are very near to the confidential advisers and friends of the great Sachem of Tammany, and say that they speak by the card. It is certain that General Butler has opened a law office in New York, and there is yet time for him to acquire the necessary legal residence. Once during the war he expressed the ambitious hope of one day being a citizen of the Empire State, and that he might, to use his own words "teach the New York Democracy how to be loyal." It is rather a late day upon which to enter on the discharge of such a mission, but it is perhaps in keeping with General Ben Butler's character to do it.

DONT WANT OFFICE.

Naches has been notified of his election as Big Chief of the Piute tribe at the recent "pow-wow" at Wadsworth, and he declines the proffered honor. He says there is no money in it, and he does not want to have the care of his people placed upon his shoulders. He has been for years the virtual chief of the Piutes in this section of the State, and is consulted on all matters of importance to the Indians, and his opinions have the greatest weight among his people. He is beyond doubt the most intelligent Piute in this part Nevada, and whether he accepts the position of Chief or not, he will continue to be a prominent personage in the councils of his tribe.

A New York Post Washington special says: It is certain, no matter who is elected President, that the present political complexion of the House will be greatly changed. Republican managers here confidently predict a small Republic, ranging from five to ten members, which will be brought about principally through expected defections from New York, Ohio, Michigan, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, California and some Southern States. A united effort is to be made to elect the election of Republican representatives in many districts in Mississippi, West Virginia, North Carolina and Louisiana.
