REPRESENTATION AND TAXATION.

The Republic of the United States is founded upon the idea that the right to be taxed carries also with it the right to be represented. If political tickets were made up on this basis there would be less trouble in politics and better men would get into office.

Each and every interest has a right to take part in saying who shall manage public affairs.

For instance, let us suppose that a county ticket is to be nominated. A large corporation comes to the front and insists on nominating the whole ticket. This causes dissatisfaction and trouble, and other interests in the county object to support the ticket on the ground that they have none on the ticket to represent them. They have a right to these objections.

But let us suppose a fairer method of doing business. Let the leading taxpayers of the party get together and figure up from the last tax roll how much property they all pay taxes on.

Let us suppose that the entire property taxed according to the Assessor's books, represents five millions of dollars. The wealthy corporation says:

"We pay one-half a million."
"All right, gentlemen, you can control one tenth of the ticket."

A number of merchants who are interested in some other office, form a combination by mutual consent and say:

"We, in the aggregate, foot up another half million and want to make another nomination."

Perhaps another crowd, bound together by social and religious ties, can aggregate another half million of taxable property, and claim the right to name a candidate.

Let it go on this way, down the list, and at once your politics is taken out of the hands of the non-producers, drones, bummers, dead beats and loafers, and placed upon a better plane.

Even the latter class could be represented pro rata, by clubbing together and showing the aggregate of poll taxes paid by them. Every industrious wage worker who owns a house and lot could have a hand in the formation of a ticket if he chose. He would simply have to combine with hundreds of others like himself, and when the aggregation of taxable property in the crowd reached a reasonable figure they could come in and claim a voice in public affairs.

Another effect this would have would be that those who are anxious to be bosses in politics would begin to figure on the proposition of paying their full taxes, as they would readily reason that it would be fully as cheap to make their position certain by paying high taxes as to contribute to the corruption fund on election day.

Suppose a wealthy corporation spends \$10,000 in a primary to place a certain man in office with still a chance of losing him. Would not that \$10,000 paid into the Treasury of the Government for taxes bring to them a more certain result?

This plan, if properly followed out, would take a good deal of corruption money out of politics and place it in the Treasuries of the State and county government, beside bringing a class of decent men in politics who now hold aloof from it.

The new Dayton paper has promised the public it would expose the methods by which the Nevada Press Association has fleeced the public. Several weeks have passed and the exposure has not been made. The True Fissure says:
