HAVE WE MUGWUMPS AMONG US?

Some time ago the Lyon County Times charged Gen Powning with the offence of Mugwumpism in the first degree. The General, through his organ, made a spirited reply, and the row attracted general attention. The Journal showed that Powning held a fat office under the Democratic Administration, and the efforts of the most powerful Democrats in the State seemed unable to move him from his secure anchorage. The dissatisfied Bourbon who have been thirsting for Powning in place. No one could object to Powning's continuance in the Federal pasture as long as he was able to nip a blade of Democratic grass, but being an avowed candidate for the Senatorship of the United States, the charge made by his enemies is that he is in the ring in Fair's interests to worry Stewart.

The APPEAL believes that Powning would be better equipped for the fight if he was not compelled to stand continually in the fierce light of Federal patronage, which, at the present time beats upon the throne of the Surveyor Generalship. The Enterprise, commenting upon the matter, says: "Quite a lively interchange of sentiment has been going on between the above journals for some time past. The Times charges that the Journal, for the last six months has contained little more than complimentary clippings of the Democratic Administration and of the Hon. J. G. Fair. The Times seems to have made good its charges. It is probably a rather a difficult thing to criticize the present Administration as it deserves, and its chief dispenser of Federal patronage in this State while in the enjoyment of a fat Federal office. It is impossible to keep a divided allegiance between Republicanism and Democracy, and the utterances of a newspaper that attempts this impracticable feat will have a vague and uncertain sound. Neither Mugwumps nor Mugwumpery has yet acquired much of a foothold in the Republican party of Nevada. It will march with solid column in the next Senatorial fight, and will tolerate no laggards in its ranks."

Storing Water.

A company in Eastern Nevada with ample capital have begun to erect dams for the purpose of storing the water which has run to waste in the winter. They have built a rock dam in a narrow defile of the hills surrounding Squaw Valley in Elko county Nev., which fills a basin of 2,000 acres to an average depth of thirteen feet; containing about 8,500,000,000 gallons. It has also constructed during this year about twenty-eight miles of irrigating ditches, the main canal having a capacity of about 25,000,000 gallons in twenty-four hours, has a thousand acres of alfalfa growing vigorously, besides grain and vegetables; and is engaged in stock-raising on a large scale. The capacity of this reservoir is sufficient to put twelve inches of water annually on about 26,000 acres of land. That might not be sufficient artificial supply on new ground unless assisted by a considerable rainfall, but it has been discovered by the company, that on land irrigated last season, water or moisture now stands within a few feet of the surface, where it was never before found at less depth at eight or ten feet, establishing the fact which has already been observed in Southern California and the San Joaquin Valley, that the soil once thoroughly moistened does not require so much surface water to produce crops. The company is converting arid sage brush plains into grain-fields by its enterprise, and showing the citizens of Nevada the way to better prosperity than they have enjoyed in the past flush mining days.
