

THE IRRIGATION QUESTION.

The outcome of the irrigation fight between Miller & Lux and Haggins & Carr is the calling of an extra session of the California Legislature. The decision of the Supreme Court in the matter sustained the common law of England to the effect that the waters of rivers could not be diverted but must be allowed to run unmolested to the sea. England is a country of fogs and rains and by reason of its humid climate needs no artificial irrigation. To apply such a law to California is the height of absurdity. The decision of the Supreme Court, if allowed to stand, not only ruins Haggins & Carr, but spreads desolation and bankruptcy over almost the entire State of California.

Haggins & Carr reclaimed the desert lands of Kern county and invested in the grand enterprise upward of ten millions of dollars. The ranch owned by them is sixty miles long and twelve wide. In improving this ranch they diverted the waters of the Kern river. They in no way injured Miller & Lux, the cattlemen. Yet the latter brought suit to withstrain the defendants from diverting the waters of the Kern river. With considerable propriety the suit might have been entitled a suit to prevent the development of California.

It is charged that William B. Carr, the politician and ex boss pulls all the wires of the extra session and has called it to overturn the Supreme Court. Well and good; he no doubt is bent upon this mission. We hope he will succeed. It will be a good deed well performed, and any one who knows Carr will bet money that he succeeds. He is a Napoleon in managing such a fight and the adversary will find before many days that he carries the heaviest artillery. If ever there was a Supreme Court that deserved to be ousted it is the crowd now making a jest and by-word of the California Supreme Bench.

The defeat of Carr in this fight means ruin to California.
