SUNSTROKE IN NEVADA.

We doubt very much if ever a genuine case of sunstroke ever occurred in Nevada. They are very common East, but it has been a boast that sunstrokes and mad dogs are unknown West of the Rockies. Charles Ruedin died suddenly at Vail Bros' ranch near Carson last Tuesday. It is an alleged case of sunstroke. Those who know most of such matters discredit the sunstroke proposition and are quite confident other causes will be found to be the true reason for the man's death.

The thermometer may be up above a hundred in a field and men at work there without danger from the sun. This is because the air is dry and rapidly evaporates the moisture from the skin, the evaporation being a cooling process. Dr. G. G. Tyrrell, of Sacramento, Secretary of the California State Board of Health, in his last report tells about a case of sunstroke, but there seems to have been as much whiskey as sun concerned in the stroke.—Reveille.

Something Unusual.

It is a common thing for newspaper men to be arrested for libel, slander and defamation of character, but it is out of the usual run for an editor to have some one jailed for injuring his character, but such a thing occurred in Butte on Saturday. There has for some time past been a firm of tea "merchants" doing business in that city, aiding their traffic by offering prizes of all manner of jewelry and some money to the gullible, and the Miner finally came out and denounced the thing as a fraud. In retaliation one of the proprietors of the concern turned loose on the editor of that paper in a street tirade with brass band accompaniment, and then City Editor Crawford had them arrested for criminal libel, compelling them to put up their entire outfit as security for their bail.—Dillon Examiner.

The Brutal Mate Watts Not Pardoned.

WASHINGTON, July 23.—Congressman Morrow saw the President today relative to the pardon of Watts, and protested against it, when the President surprised him by saying that he had changed his mind in the case. Morrow called the President's attention to the fact that the pardon had been telegraphed as having been issued. Cleveland replied that it was a mistake. The President said such had been his intention. Within a few days, Mr. Cleveland said he had received information which led him to change his mind. It was not denied that the pardon was made out, but it had not been sent, nor will it be, and Watts will have to serve out his sentence without hope of executive clemency.
