**THE CUTTING CASE.**

The Cutting case appears to be reaching a crisis, and if Congress were to remain in session much longer we would be pretty sure of some decisive action. Whether the administration will keep up to the mark without the prodding of Congress to help it is a little doubtful, but, according to this morning's dispatches, it seems to realize the need for energy. The Foreign Affairs Committee of the House has unanimously adopted a resolution declaring that Mexico's reasons for the detention of Cutting cannot be accepted, and advising the President to renew the demand for his release. It is thought that if the House passes the resolution, the vigorous policy desired will be carried out by the administration, and that a continued refusal of justice by Mexico would lead to an extra session of Congress and the recall of our Minister. It will be refreshing if a little dignified firmness can be infused into our foreign policy. The apathy of some politicians and journals on this subject is scandalous. They treat it solely as the individual affair of Mr. Cutting, and because that gentleman may not be the most agreeable person in existence, they assume that we should leave him to his fate. It is not Cutting that has been insulted, but the United States, and it is the United States with which the Mexicans will have to reckon.

**SAMUEL J. TILDEN.**

The death of Samuel J. Tilden has been so long expected that the announcement of the event causes very little surprise. He has been the most noted Democrat of the present generation, and probably had a larger personal following than any other man in his party. His physical strength has been such that he was not warranted in accepting the Presidential nomination on the last two tickets, which he could undoubtedly have had, as the belief entertained by the Democrats, that he was elected in 1876, gave him the first claim for consideration at their hands. Under the present system the electoral, and not the popular vote, determines the selection of President, otherwise Tilden would have held the Chair instead of Hayes, as he held a plurality vote over Hayes of 252,224, having polled the largest vote of any Presidential candidate up to that time. This is by many considered as great an honor as having actually been declared President. Since that campaign he can hardly have been considered an active leader of the Democratic party.

A passenger on the Queen of the Pacific, while at Victoria, B. C., had a bag containing Peruvian dollars in his possession, and as a tax is imposed on all foreign coin going into Canada the bag was seized by a customs officer, whereupon the owner of the money became violently insane and jumped into the water. He was rescued and confined in a stateroom under guard and his money returned to him, after the fact was ascertained that the money was in transit from Puget Sound and not liable for duty.

The election of A. P. Williams for United States Senator to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Senator John F. Miller appears to give general satisfaction to the Republicans of California. Mr Williams was absent in the East at the time and not anticipating such an honor. He is spoken of as a man of fine business habits, strictly honorable and an energetic Republican.

The citizens of Newark, N. J. are in a state of great excitement over several cases of supposed cholera. The victims are taken with dysentery accompanied by hemorrhages. One death has already occurred.
