THE MEXICAN DIFFERENTIAL.

The facts concerning the Cutting case, which is exciting so much attention in both Republics, are, as near as can be gathered, about as follows:

A. K. Cutting, an American citizen publisher of a newspaper called El Centinela, in the Mexican town of Paso del Norte, printed an article in which he asserted that Emilio Medina, a Mexican citizen and publisher of a rival paper, was a fraud and his newspaper a scheme to swindle advertisers. A Mexican Court, on Medina's complaint, compelled Cutting to make a retraction. Cutting then put a card in the Sunday Herald, published in El Paso, on the American side of the Rio Grande, as follows:

In a late issue of El Centinela, published in Paso del Norte, Mexico, I made the assertion that Emilio Medina was a fraud, and that the Spanish newspaper he proposed to issue in Paso del Norte was a scheme to swindle advertisers. The Mexican Court, on Medina's complaint, compelled Cutting to make a retraction. Cutting then put a card in the Sunday Herald, published in El Paso, on the American side of the Rio Grande, as follows: Now, I do hereby reiterate my original assertion that said Emilio Medina is a fraud, and add death to the same; also, that his taking advantage of the Mexican law and forcing me to a retraction was contemptible and cowardly and in keeping with the odious reputation of said Emilio Medina. Should the said Emilio Medina desire American satisfaction for this reiteration, I will be pleased to grant him all he may desire at any time in any manner.

A. K. CUTTING.

On his return to Paso del Norte Cutting was arrested on the complaint of Medina, the Mexican Judge assuming jurisdiction. On being brought before the Court immediately after his arrest, Cutting, while indirectly admitting the offense, demanded his discharge on the ground that the Court had no jurisdiction over anything done in the United States. United States Consul Brigham supported this demand, but the Court ruled out the plea, and advised the prisoner to employ an attorney to make the necessary motions to protect his rights and expedite his trial. Cutting refused to do that, or to furnish bail, and was retained in jail. Three days later he was formally committed for trial. Mexican jails are not very comfortable and the fare is poor. Consul Brigham represented Cutting's sufferings to Mr. Jackson, United States Minister to Mexico, who took the case to the Mexican Foreign Office. It was assumed that under the Constitution of Mexico the Federal Government has no mandatory powers over the State governments and Courts, so long as they act within and according to the laws. The President of the Republic, therefore, assumed to have discharged his duty in the matter when he referred our Consul's complaint to the Governor of Chihuahua, with the request that Cutting's sufferings be mitigated so far as possible, and his case brought to a fair trial. The Governor, in his turn, assuming to be unable to interfere with the action of the Court, referred the complaint to the Supreme Court of the State, and in a few days Mr. Cutting's jail accommodations and food were improved, and the lower Court was ordered to give him a fair trial and report the progress of the case every three days.

Pending these dispositions Minister Jackson sent a note to the Mexican Minister of foreign affairs, inclosing the following:

You are instructed to demand from the Mexican Government the immediate discharge of A. K. Cutting, an American citizen unlawfully arrested at Paso del Norte.

The Mexican Foreign Office at once obtained from the Chihuahua authorities their full statement of the case, including an account of the relief afforded Cutting, and in response to Minister Jackson's complaint that his communication had not received due attention, Mr. Marshall, Secretary of Foreign Affairs, sent a reply, giving his version of the aspects of the case, and refusing to release Cutting. There is no official information as

to whether Cutting's trial has begun; some reports are to the effect that he has been convicted. Secretary Bayard thinks Mexico will do what is right in the matter.
