**THE PARTY OF DESTRUCTION.**

A new thing in politics, and one that could never have been incubated outside of Ormsby county, is to have a party whose main idea is based upon the destruction of the business interests of the community.

One hardly knows where to class such a party. It reminds one of a scientist discovering a new bird or reptile. They might appropriately be called the "Fall Downers." The sagacious manipulators of the new party, who, of course, are Democrats, have mapped out a programme for the Fall campaign. The platform of the party appears about as follows when summed up:

The driving from the county of every man who helped to develop it.

The depreciation of property values.

The downfall of men who employ white help.

The uplifting of men who do not.

It would at first flash seem that no one outside a Socialist hearth could be found who would be willing to stand upon such a platform. They have been found however, and they now occupy the standing room upon the platform.

These men are being led through the prejudice of blindness by men who propose to use them for a temporary purpose only.

Let the citizens of Carson see to it that the men who have incubated this conspiracy to down the town of Carson by driving capital and enterprise away from it are made to feel that a clique of disappointed cranks do not run this city. They have come up in various disguises, and masqueraded along the boards over and over again, but their lunacy was of the mild type.

Their proposition to loot the city of Carson, to crush all who are engaged in building up the country, to dictate the methods by which old taxpayers shall conduct their business, is one which carries their heretofore harmless vagaries beyond the line where patience is a virtue. Every good citizen should assist his neighbors in meeting the present trouble and disposing of it. This movement of the cranks should be squelched, and forever, upon the broad basis that it is a public nuisance and should be abated. The regular taxpayers of the city have but one course to pursue, and they should make the action effective.

Judge McAlister will contest the President's right to remove him as United States Judge for Alaska, and the case will be brought up at the October meeting of the Supreme Court.
