**THE COMING TICKET.**

The Elko Free Press has the following: The ticket just nominated by our sister State, California, is one of the strongest ever put up, and contains the names of some of her brightest men, led by that brilliant leader, John F. Swift of San Francisco.

The Republican State Convention of Nevada which meets at Carson City the 24th of this month, should try to follow in the footsteps of the Republican Convention of the Golden State, and nominate a ticket that will carry all before it.

This can be done if the Republicans of each county will only send good representative men as delegates to the convention. Men who will take into consideration every question as to the availability, qualification, and strength of each candidate brought forward in the convention.

There is plenty of good material in the Republican party of Nevada from which to select a winning ticket. A ticket that can and will be cheerfully supported by every true Republican in the State.

For Congressman, Hon. Wm. Woodburn's name will, without a doubt, be selected to head the ticket. He has made a faithful Representative, and will be returned to Washington by the voters of Nevada.

With such names as Kinkead, Davis, Riekey, Stevenson and Nichols to select from, there should be no trouble in making a wise selection for Governor.

Then for Lieutenant Governor we hear of Turrin, Laughton, Egar, Farrell and Foley any one of whom would fill the position with dignity and ability.

For Secretary of State the present incumbent, J. M. Dornier is considerably talked of, as also are G. I. Lammon of Storey, Wells Drury of Ormsby and J. E. Jones of Eureka.

There are a number of good men for District Judgeships, among the leading ones being Rising, Bigelow, Edwards, McKenny and Murphy. One of these will in all probability have to take the nomination for Supreme Judge.

For the other positions on the ticket there will be presented a number of good names. Names that will add strength to the ticket, and poll the full party vote.

But the first duty of every Republican in Nevada is to send representative men as delegates to the State Convention. If they do this there will be no trouble in following the example of the California Republicans in selecting a splendid ticket. One that each and every Republican can support with a feeling that it will be successful from top to bottom.

**THE STATE'S PROSPERITY**

The San Francisco Bulletin has the following sensible remarks about Nevada:

Since the exhaustion of the Comstock bonanzas the falling-off in the bullion product of some of the older mining camps, and the drop in the price of silver it has become the fashion to speak of Nevada as the played out State. It is probably true that there has been a loss of population since the flush times of early mining, but the indications now point to a better and more permanent prosperity. Even in the mining industry the future holds out promise. The old Comstock itself has vitality left. Plans are afoot to cheapen bullion production to a figure that will admit of the working of the great masses of low grade ore. The bed of the Carson river is to be worked over for the millions which are believed to be held by the tailings from the mines, which have been poured into the stream for a quarter of a century. New mineral developments are being made in various parts of the State. Parties are working the borax fields. The great salt deposits will give rise to an important industry when brought within railroad communication. Arrangements have been made for the erection of reduction works at Reno which will encourage mining. The company has obtained a tract of land on the Truckee river, and building will be commenced in a few days. The enterprise is in the hands of practical men and the location of the works is convenient to all the mining districts of the

State adjacent to railroad lines. The ores that have heretofore been sent to Utah and Colorado for treatment can be worked at less trouble and expense on the completion of this undertaking. The stock-raising interests of the State are advancing. Land sales are on a considerable scale. Several companies have already satisfactorily tested the practicability of irrigation, by storing water and by artesian wells. There is a great deal of land which only needs the application of water to become highly productive. Grain, alfalfa and fruit are already successfully grown. The climate is unsurpassed for salubrity, and as all these advantages and opportunities become more generally known the recovery of Nevada from its period of depression can be only a question of time.

The water planks in the State platforms of California are well suited to all shades of opinion. Irrigationists and riparianists, both and each, see in the water plank a confirmation and expression of their views. The riparianists say the plank is riparian, and the irrigationists want no better water distributor than that same plank. That plank seems soft for the lying down of the lion and the lamb.
