**THE CONDITIONS.**

In another column a correspondent presents some arguments against the plan of electing a United States Senator, discussed in yesterday's APPEAL. It does not strike the APPEAL that there is much probability of a contingency occurring in the Legislature, such as he assumes might take place; yet it is but fair to say that things just as strange have happened in politics.

The APPEAL has only heard vague rumors of what was proposed at the Virginia conference. The candidates agreed to each contribute an equal sum to the fight, and all pull for the Republican ticket. Mr. Stewart proposed \$20,000 each as the basis, making \$80,000 in all if Daggett, Wren and Powning came in also.

Since then we understand that Daggett has decided to go before the Convention and ask for the gubernatorial nomination. Mr. Powning agreed to the plan and stated that he would put in \$20,000, but since the result in Washoe county last Saturday, it is stated that Powning has withdrawn. Mr. Wren of Eureka, has not yet been heard from on the proposition, but his friends say he is out of the fight.

**THE DEMOCRATIC PLATFORM.**

The framers of the Democratic platform at Elko had a hard struggle with some very knotty problems. The plank relative to the Administration simply reads as follows:

"We endorse the Administration but don't like its style."

It reminds one of the man who was in favor of a certain law, but not its enforcement.

After endorsing Cleveland it demands of him that he immediately set about to do quite a number of things that he omitted to do. They also read the Administration a sound lecture for closing the Mint, and then they proceed to lay the blame on the Republican Convention of California.

It berates the Administration for following the beaten path of the Republican party on the silver question. In the wording of this plank they overlooked the fact that had Cleveland followed the afore-said beaten path of the Republican Administration the Carson Mint would be still running, and "a proper regard for the welfare of the workmen" [see plank VIII] would still be practically exemplified.

It concludes by announcing the fact that the Statesmen, soldiers and patriots of the Democratic party are all dead. [see plank XV.]

**Why Difficult.**

The Grass Valley Tidings says: "A man to be a success at the head of a party, or when high in the party's council, ought to be a politician—an honest one if such can be found." And why should it be difficult to find men of that order? The politician is one who makes the policies, condition and best interests of his country his concern and the science of Government his study. Is there anything inconsistent with honesty in such devotion? The man who puts up slates, bribes voters with coin or promises, makes and unmakes rings, and manipulates men to serve gross ambitions, is not a politician, in any decent sense of the word.—Sacramento Record Union.

We cannot answer as to why it is difficult to find an honest politician. We only know that such is a fact. Our observation and experience shows us that the honest politician is "a rare swimmer in the vast whirlpool." We can remember that when we were, ourselves, a hot partisan politician we were no better than we should be by a darned sight.—Grass Valley Union.
