REPUBLICAN CONVENTION.

Permanent Organization Elected.

PHILIP BOYLE OF CARSON, CHAIRMAN.

Adjourned Until 9 o'clock This Morning.

The Convention was called to order by C. C. Stevenson, chairman of the State Central Committee. In a short speech he called the attention of the Convention to the important trust which had brought them together and urged that the Convention would in its unpledged capacity nominate the strongest men. Such a course would ensure party harmony and place a winning ticket in the field.

Mr. Wren placed Phillip Doyle in nomination for Chairman. Dovey nominated Thomas Wren of Eureka. Mr. Wren declined. The nomination was made unanimous and Mr. Doyle escorted to the chair. Mr. Doyle thanked the Convention for the nomination and pledged the convention that his actions would be governed alone by a regard for the good of the party.

Wines of Eureka nominated William Hy Doane as Temporary Secretary. Hon. Thomas Wells of Eureka seconded the motion. Unanimously elected. M. E. Wilson was elected Assistant Secretary. G. R. Dobbs, of Ormsby and Clas. W. Jones of Washoe and Napoleon King of Storey were placed in nomination for Sergeant at Arms. Dobbs elected on the first ballot.

M. E. Glover of Ormsby County and Napoleon King of Storey were placed in nomination as Assistant Sergeant at arms. Mr. King was elected.
