**MORE SUNSHINE.**

Democratic papers are endeavoring to make capital out of the fact that an assay office has been opened in what used to be the Carson Mint. Nevada does not need an opposition assay office to those at Reno or on the Comstock, she needs a mint. There are just as good assay offices run by private parties, their stamp on the brick is worth just as much, and they don't charge \$4 50 for each assay either. The fact is the end has come and the Silver State is not justified in saying:

This action has been taken on the recommendation of the Directors of the mint, and with the full approval of the President, who has been urged by Senator Fair, in accordance with the interests of his constituents, to do so. It is intended as an experiment, as the Department thinks it doubtful whether the deposits will warrant its conduction as an assay office, and its future operations as a coinage mint will depend altogether upon the extent of the deposits.

The Carson mint has never needed any experiment to prove its success. It has more than paid expenses since it started, and in 1885 it made a net profit of \$7, 147. At the time of the suspension its vaults contained \$3,341, 233 in dollars, and 407,017 ounces of bullion. That does not look like failure. The Silver State says:

The mint will be conducted on business; not partisan principles. If it is patronized it will be kept open, if not it will be closed.

The only fault ever found with Superintendent Crawford was that he absolutely refused to use the mint in politics. He employed Democrats or Republicans whichever were best fitted for the work to be done, and kept W. H. Byrne as cashier for years against the protests of Republicans. This week the Democrats appointed Mr. Byrne to a position in the post office at San Francisco.—Reno Gazette.

**A SNEAKING CAMPAIGN.**

Col. Fair is a candidate for reelection to the United States Senate, and his method of making the fight is perfectly characteristic of himself. He dare not come before the people of Nevada and make an open canvass for the office, but is bribing men in the Republican party to act as his political confederates. On election day a corruption fund will be in every county in this State where he thinks he has any show. If he succeeds in purchasing a majority of the votes and electing a Legislative ticket he will then come before the Legislature demanding the office, and if he fails he will put his losses on the wrong side of his campaign ledger and say that he never had any aspirations for the place, and would not wipe his feet on it. Why does not Fair come into this campaign like a man; make his candidacy known, and conduct his canvass openly? It is simply because he dare not face the record which will be presented to the voters of Nevada. A record so appalling that the most corruptible voter in Nevada would shrink from the contamination of his bribes, as he would from contact with a leper.

California has a mixed mess this year in politics. The Report says:

There are twenty-seven political organizations in the field, led by ten candidates for the Governorship; and, unless gold or grim death gets in its work before November 2d, quarters might as well be got ready in the asylum at Napa for the unfortunate newspaper men who will have to make up the election returns.
