## POWNING'S DESEPTION.

In yesterday's Journal, Powning announces that he has no longer any political ambition.

The APPEAL is glad to learn that Mr. Powning has finally decided to divest himself of the robes of self conceit, which for years he has wrapped himself in and now walks about the country in the more becoming garments of humility.

Mr. Powning has made the serious mistake in politics made by many other men, of over-sizing himself. He has demonstrated that he can make a good State Senator, yet all who ever saw him on the floor of the Senate agreed that he would stand better by sitting down of- ficer. His constant aim was to be conspicuous, like a professional traveling beauty. He should have taken an inventory of his talents and been contented with his political success.

But no; he wanted to run for Congress. He was allowed to do so, and in a Republican State beaten by over a thousand majority. He should have taken this as a gentle hint to set down and be quiet, but he never could be made to realize that he was fairly de- feated. To vindicate himself he sprang into the ring to compete with men who had been recognized as mental and financial giants in Washington.

He felt that he had done more for the party than Wren, was a bet- ter writer than Daggett, a speedier financier than Fair, and a better politician and debater than Stewart.

When he announced himself, a broad smile stretched itself over the sagebrush from Eureka to Storey, but when Powning saw that smile he mistook it for a beam of unrestrained delight from the face of the Republican party.

He opened his campaign by a brush attack on his betters. He ran full tilt against everybody, boasting, arrogant and insulting; boiling over with brag and bluster, full of froth, foam and fury, load- ed down to the water's edge with confidence in himself, and a con- tempt of everybody else. He slapped Stewart's face and spat in it every day through the columns of his paper.

With Stewart a dignified fore- bearing ceased to be a virtue, and one day he went down to Washoe county, found something buzzing about, shaped his hand into a scoop, and with a single quick motion caught and crushed the fly.

This is the whole story. Look- back several years, people are be- ginning to ask what Powning has done for the party except thrive at its expense. The lesson has been a severe one, but he has brought it on himself. That he richly de- served it is best condensed by the fact that he has not the political stuff in him to stand defeat. Men who enter political life must expect to stand the reverses of battle, but Powning pampered ten years with the spoils of office, and the luxuries of camp life, finds himself unable to stand the wounds of war without filling the air with the noisy clamor and undignified squealing which one would only look for in the raw recruit.

He is now a deserter from the Republican camp, and let it be re- membered that he deserted his colors in the hour of danger and on the eve of engagement.

## RENO BOLTERS.

A faction in Reno, fortunately small, has made a bolt on the Re- publican Legislative ticket, and are not only working directly in the interest of Senator Fair; but they are doing a great deal of damage to the whole State ticket elsewhere. They are only half a dozen strong, but they are all full of cackle and by button-holing passengers going through, and pouring a tale of dis- content into their ears; they are trying to spread the impression abroad that they will succeed in beating the ticket, or part of the ticket here. Partly through per- sonal pressure, and partly by work- ing on their dislike of some of the candidates, some of the Republi- cans of the town are being wheeled as the bolt. If every Republican bolted every nominee that was not his own personal choice, it would

be a difficult matter to elect any ticket. But we believe that a higher consideration will influence the Republicans of this county. We do not believe that Senator Fair has won their love and confidence to such an extent that they will vote to send him back and turn the United States Senate over to Cleve- land's anti-Nevada Administration. —Gazette.

The ballots used at said election shall be of good quality of white book paper, 10 inches long by 4 1/2 inches in width. The names thereon printed shall be in bourgeois or brevier capitals. The designation of office in brevier or nonpareil, and the form of printing shall be on the left hand margin of the ballot.


