

THE CRANKS OF ECONOMY.

Economy is a thing everlastingly being preached in the management of public affairs; yet there is only one time when economy ought to be practiced, and that is when it becomes an absolute necessity, and there is no other course open.

The United States is just now suffering from the vagaries of the narrow-minded economic cranks, who are now posing before the country as the watch dogs of the Treasury. The Democratic party is trying hard to save all it can, and the saving is effected by crippling every possible branch of the public service, by cutting down the wages of mechanics, and by making every man in the service do the work of two.

The people of the United States do not want any such economic nonsense as this, nor will they tolerate it, either.

The vast sums of money accumulated in the public Treasury are placed there by the people, and it belongs to them now. They expect in return for the payment of these taxes, an army to protect the Western border from the invaders, a Government capable of protecting the rights of citizens, and a navy capable of shielding our sea board from the invasion of foreign foes. The money placed at the disposal of Congress has not been used for any such purpose. In fact, it is hard to ascertain what the devil it is being used for.

If any European country were to conclude to sail across the Atlantic and destroy New York it would only take it about two days to level the city. Of course, it would not be done. The foreign fleet would simply sail up to the city and demand a ransom of several hundred millions to let it alone, and the United States Government would have to raise the money. Would it not be economy to have an American fleet all ready to meet the invaders and blow them out of the water?

This fleet would long ago have been a reality were it not for the economy cranks who croak of financial disaster, and fight everything that hints at an appropriation of public money for public use.

The money belongs, not to the high stomached officials, but to the tax payers, and ninety per cent. of the taxpayers of America want a navy that will cost from twenty to fifty million dollars. Starting as it may seem, it is never the less a fact, that the most flagrant extravagance of public money is in the long run, of more direct benefit to the people than the scrimping economic system. New York never saw better times than when Boss Tweed was gutting the public treasury and scattering the money among the crowd.

The poor were given jobs on the public works, and the men, who under the economic regime had been tramping the streets, took home their wages every Saturday night to cheer the wife and little ones. The money that Tweed took from the treasury went right back to the people where it came from. We do not endorse this method of distributing money, but assert that it gave the masses a more direct benefit than they have ever received from the parsimonious Democratic Administration.

A Railroad Circular.

A circular has been issued by General Freight and Passenger Agent Bender, of the Carson & Colorado and Virginia & Truckee Railroad Companies, to agents, requesting them to notify all shippers and consignees, that on and after April 5th, when the Inter-State Commerce law goes into effect, all rates in conflict with said law will be canceled and void. He says: "Having received notice from the Southern Pacific Company that the through special rates now in force on inter-State freight from points on the Southern Pacific Company's roads to points on the Virginia & Truckee and Carson & Colorado roads, and from points on the Virginia & Truckee and Carson & Colorado roads to points on the Southern Pacific Company's line, will be withdrawn on April 5th next, you will thereafter apply the rates named on such freight in local freight tariffs."


