

THE CITY PRINTING.

In another column of the APPEAL appears a report of a meeting of the City Trustees, relative to letting a printing contract. The Union appeared to be the only paper notified to put in a bid and it was put in at the very top legal rates. The APPEAL was fully aware of the figures in this bid, and it did not underbid as it considers the rate fixed by law to be low enough.

The letting of this contract to the Union, by the Board of Trustees is liable to violate several laws.

1st. The Union bid is an agreement to advertise the Registry list. There is no law authorizing the advertising of a city Registry list. It is a piece of job work and must be printed and posted as a separate job, and cannot legally appear in a newspaper.

2nd. The City Trustees have no right to let a contract for the printing of the Registry list. The power to let such a contract lies wholly with the Justice of the Peace, who is Ex-Office Register.

3rd. No member of the Board of Trustees has any right to be interested in a municipal contract, and any member so interested is liable to a fine of \$500 and two years in the Penitentiary.

It is generally understood, that Mr. Muller is a stock-holder in the Nevada Union and if such be the case he cannot, as a City Trustee, let a contract to any corporation in which he is interested. In letting the hose contract to himself about a year ago, Mr. Muller violated Statute 1710, but it was overlooked. Being fairly warned however he accepted a State contract, and again laid himself liable to fine and imprisonment.

If he becomes interested in a printing contract as a stockholder of the Union, he again comes within the law. How long Mr. Muller proposes to keep up his tramping of the law under foot, the APPEAL is not advised, but we should think that it is about time, that he as a City Trustee, read Section 1710 and get it through his head, that it is a dangerous Section to monkey with.

The APPEAL does not care a pin for the printing contract at anything less than the regular rates. We are not publishing a paper for pastime or glory, nor do we care to take any contracts at any less than what we consider living rates.

—We understand that a lengthy communication was received at the office of a Carson newspaper from Mr. Bell, and that it was declined on account of its length. As the APPEAL has had considerable to say about Mr. Bell, we will state that we will cheerfully publish any communication from Mr. Bell that any other paper has declined. 
