

THE GAME LAW.

The game law passed at the last session of the Legislature, is so pointed and concise as to admit of but one meaning. It is as follows: "It shall be unlawful for any person, at any time after the first day of January and before the first day of September in each year, to catch, kill or destroy, or to pursue with such intent, any deer, antelope, elk, mountain sheep or goat, or to have in his possession, or to expose for sale, or to purchase any of the animals mentioned in this Section."

It will be seen by the above that venison is a contraband article until Sept. 1st. Sportsmen who are inclined to shoot everything they see, should paste the law in their hats and be governed by it, if they would avoid trouble. Deer may be shot in California at this time but may not be brought into Nevada, upon any pretext. If the law is arbitrary and too binding, the best way is to make it obnoxious by rigidly enforcing it.

The game laws have been tinkered and vamped until they are in some instances mixed beyond comprehension; but their spirit and intent are apparent, and the true sportsman will abide by them without any attempt at subterfuge.

While on this subject it may not be amiss to say again, as the APPEAL has said before, that the greatest enemies to game are Indians, who mercilessly slaughter every live thing, whether they can utilize it or not. They will shoot a grouse on her nest with a half-hatched clutch of eggs under her, or kill a doe when big with young. They will depe a trout stream, with soap-root and kill hundreds of fish when a dozen will supply their wants. This should be stopped. The average Indian is no better than a white man and he should be subject to the same rules.

A Genuine Chestnut.

It is said that gold has been discovered again at the Big Bend of the Carson river. Every year or two somebody finds a few colors there, when the gilded report of a greenhorn starts a short lived-excitement that seldom extends beyond the immediate neighborhood. A ghostly prospect of gold can be obtained at intervals all along the river, but is so infinitesimally fine that it would take a ton of it to weigh an ounce.

If a man should dig clams and take the shells for his pay, he would make more money than by placer mining on the Carson. There is a streak of gravel near Empire, however, that once in a while gives out a tantalizing prospect of comparatively coarse gold, but it is too spotted to swear by.

Complying With The Law.

At a recent meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Humboldt county Sheriff Fellows was authorized by the Board to have the doors to the main building, which opened inward changed so as to open outward, in compliance with an act of the Legislature. The Sheriff employed William Blockstock to hang the doors as provided by law, and he has done so. Anybody going in or out of the Court house can now push his way through, as the doors open both ways.

Funny incident is told by the London correspondent of the New York Sun. At a distinguished occasion in London last week Miss Emma Nevada, the famous artist, was present. So was Buffalo Bill. An English lady was introduced to Buffalo Bill and then to Miss Nevada. E. T. Murry has been appointed Mail Clerk on the C. & C., vice Ernest Cary, resigned. Murry is a California boy, appointed probably by Senator Hearst. Several leading Democrats of Nevada endorsed W. S. Cox, of Genoa, but no attention was paid to it.
