SAWYER AND THE CHINESE.

It seems utterly impossible for Congress to pass a law against the Chinese which will stick with Judge Sawyer, of San Francisco. Every Act of Congress is construed by him in favor of the Mongol. Recently, however, a case came before his Court, where it was not deemed possible for him to find an excuse to rule for the Chanaman.

Lee Chung Mus arrived by the last trip of the Oceanic. His statement, taken on shipboard, was as follows:

I spent the last of my money twenty days before I left China. Hong Wing & Co. bought the ticket for me to San Francisco. Hong Wing & Co. are no relatives of mine. They advanced me the money necessary to land me in San Francisco, and I agreed to pay it back in monthly payments.

He was detained under the following provision of the Contract Labor law of 1885:

It shall be unlawful for any person, company, partnership or corporation, in any manner whatsoever, to prepay the transportation, or in any way assist or encourage the importation or immigration of any alien or aliens, any foreigner or foreigners, into the United States, its Territories, or the District of Columbia, under contract or agreement, parole or special, express or implied, to perform labor or service of any kind in the United States, its Territories or the District of Columbia.

The Act is expressed in perfectly plain language, and by his own statement Lee Chung Mus comes under its operation. His passage was paid by a "company or partnership," and he came here to perform "labor or service." There is no claim that he was exempt as an "actor, artist, lecturer or singer." He was only a Chinese laborer. As the Act applied to him in every other particular, the evident meaning of his release is that the Contract Labor law does not apply to the Chinese race.

Sawyer promptly decided that the law had no bearing on the case. Yet only last week in New York an Italian was denied a landing in the United States under the same law, by the Judge of the New York Circuit Court.

If Sawyer proposes to place his own individual opinions above the Acts of Congress it is time that he resigned. However, Sawyer has some relatives in his Court, who have long made a fat thing out of the habeas corpus business. The fees are \$17.50 for each case, and most of it goes in the pockets of the tribe of Sawyer.

THE MOORE CASE.

The acquittal of J. L. Moore tried in Washoe county for the murder of his daughter Alice, closes one of the most revolting cases in the criminal annals of the Coast. The entire family constituted a hard crowd. The sisters of the dead girl swore that they saw the father beat her to death. His defense was, that she committed suicide by strychnine poison. The body was exhumed and poison found in the stomach.

Moore, the defendant, swore that the girl, just before she died, put her arms about his neck and said, "I love you papa." His statement was a lie and the Jury ought to have so considered it. No girl could talk that way in the throes of strychnine poison and the father's course toward his daughter was not likely to inspire love. He was a brutal fiendish, children-whipping man and may thank his stars that he escaped legal punishment.

The Labor Unions set down how many apprentices can be used to a certain number of journeymen employed. Meanwhile the young boys cannot learn a trade, and foreigners are imported to compete in the ranks of labor. By shutting off the foreign invasion and letting American boys learn trades, would not the competition be less, would not the money be kept at home, and would not wages be higher and times be easier?

Laur and Cassagnac are still challenging each other to a duel. When both are so anxious to fight
