THE DISTRICT FAIR.

The Racing Programme for the Week.

First day. Introductory. Three-quarter dash, for District horses, \$100 added; entrance \$20 declaration \$5 or before Sept. 1st.
Running—Five eighths mile dash, District horses, \$100 added; entrance \$20 declaration \$2 or before Sept. 1st.
Trotting—230 class free for all. Purses \$200, first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50. There will be two more races made for this day.

Second Day, Tuesday, Oct. 4.

Running—Selling purse for District, dash of mile, \$150 added; \$25 entrance half forfeit; \$5 declaration on or before Sept. 1st. Horses to be sold for \$1000 to carry entire weight. Two pounds at lower for each \$500 under the \$1000.
Trotting—Mile and repeat; free for all three-year-olds and under in the District; purse \$200; first horse \$150, second horse \$100. Third horse \$50.
Pacing—Mile heats, three in five, free for all; purse \$200; first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50.

Third Day, Oct. 5.

Merchants' Stake, Running—Three-quarter dash, 2-year-olds, \$50 added; \$25 entrance, half forfeit. Five or more to enter.
Running—Mile and three eighths, 3-year-olds, \$200 added; \$50 entrance, half forfeit; \$5 declaration on or before Sept. 1st, three or more to start.
Running—Purse \$500; dash of two miles; ten per cent. entrance; five or more to enter, three or more to start.
Trotting—Mile heats, three in five; free for all District horses, purse \$200; first horse \$150; second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
There will be two more races made up for this day.

Fourth Day, Oct. 6.

Trotting—235 class; mile heats, three in five, free for all, purse \$200, first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
Trotting—222 class; mile heats, three in five; free for all District horses; first horse \$150; second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
There will be two more races made up for this day.

Fifth Day, Oct. 7.

V. & T. R. R. Handicap—Mile and a half dash, \$300 added, \$50 entrance, half forfeit, \$100 declaration on or before Sept. 1st. Weights to be announced Sept. 1st.
Selling purse—Closes the same time as stakes; one mile and a quarter dash; \$200 added.
Pacing—Mile heats, three in five, free for all; purse \$200; first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
Three other races for this day will be made.

Sixth Day, Oct. 8.

Consolation purse, running—For all horses who have run at the meeting and have not won. Purses \$100, three quarters of a mile dash; entrance free.
Pacing—Free for all District horses; mile heats, three in five, purse \$200; first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
Trotting—Mile heats, three in five, free for all; purse \$200; first horse \$150, second horse \$100, third horse \$50.
Three other races will be made up for this day.

REMARKS AND CONDITIONS.

Non starters to stakes must be made to the secretary on or before the first day of August, 1887. Entries for all purses must be made on the Saturday preceding the day of the race, and for Wednesday's races on Monday, and for Friday's races on Wednesday, at 10 o'clock, time for closing entries as designated by the rules. Those who have nominated in stakes must name to the secretary the day on which they will start, and the day before the race, at 6 P. M. Horses entered in purses can only be drawn by consent of the judges.

The rules of the Pacific Blood Horse Association will govern running races. All horses entered for District purses must be owned and kept in Nevada, California, east of the Sierra Nevada mountains, for six months prior to day of race.

Entries for all trotting races will close September 1st, with the secretary.

Five or more to enter, three or more to start in all races for purses.

National Trotting Association Rules to govern trotting races. Pacific Coast Blood Horse Rules to govern running races, except as above.

All trotting and pacing races are the best three in five, unless otherwise specified; five to enter and three to start. But the board reserves the right to hold a less number than five to fill, by the withdrawal of a proportionate amount of the purse. Entrance fee, ten per cent. on purse, to accompany nomination.

National Trotting Association rules to govern trotting; but the board reserves the right to trot heats of any two classes alternately, if necessary to finish any day's racing, or to trot a special race between heats. A horse making a walk-over shall be entitled only to the entrance money paid in. When less than the required number of starters appear they may contest for the entrance money, to be divided as follows: 65% to the first, and 35% to the second.

In all the foregoing stakes the declarations are void unless accompanied by the money.

Please observe that in the above stakes declarations are permitted for a small forfeit.

In all races entries not declared out by 6 P. M. of the day preceding the race shall be required to start.

Where there is more than one entry by one person, or in the interest, the particular horse they are to start must be named by 6 P. M. of the day preceding the race. No added money paid for a walk-over.
