

**BLAINE AND ALGER.**

**A PIN-HEADED BOARD.**

The people of Sacramento ought at the next election to elect a new Board of Supervisors in place of the short-sighted men who now run the municipal government.

At a recent meeting of the Board a resolution was passed cutting down the rate of official advertising paid the Bee, just 50 per cent.

The law in California, just as the law in this State, fixes the rate of official advertising, and nothing short of a Legislative enactment can change it. Again, even had the Supervisors the right to cut down the rates paid to the official organ, it would be mighty poor policy. During the last few years the Bee has done excellent work for Sacramento in advocating the growing interests of the city, and this sort of work has materially advanced property in Sacramento. It would be safe to say that during the past ten years the newspapers of Sacramento have directly caused an advance of 100 per cent. in the price of property in Sacramento. Instead of cutting down the rates for the Bee, the citizens could well afford the paltry tax resulting from increasing the official rates.

The Supervisors are merely a body of malevolent mud heads, who, to punish the Bee and feed some little petty private grudge, seek revenge in this shortsighted, unbusiness-like way. The people should repudiate the whole gang.

**PACIFIC COAST ITEMS.**

—Five burglaries in San Jose so far this week.

—Recently a San Francisco commercial man lost \$3,000 in a poker game run in conjunction with a cigar store at San Diego.

—Over two thousand passengers arrived at San Diego during the past month from San Francisco by steamer and eight thousand by rail.

—Work on the San Joaquin Valley Railroad, which is graded to within seven miles of Fresno, has been stopped. The cause is not known.

—The steamer Anson from Alaska brings news that some excitement prevailed at Juneau over the discovery of a large deposit of gold bearing black sand on the seashore 200 miles North.

—In the Utah Counsel Wednesday, Marshall (Liberal) read a statement that he had discovered discrepancies in the Territorial Auditor's and Treasurer's accounts, amounting in the aggregate to over \$35,000.

—Benjamin Graham and John Stevens were suffocated in their sleep at Departure Bay on Friday last. Their cabin was close, and it is supposed the wind blew the coal-gas from the stove into the room and the sleepers were asphyxiated.

**An Indiscreet White Pine Rancher.**

Miriam A. Liddle was granted a divorce in San Francisco last week from James A. Liddle, a White Pine county rancher. The testimony introduced during the trial showed that he was criminally intimate with a young squaw, and that the latter gave birth to a child which he recognized as his offspring. The community property involved in the suit amounted to about \$12,000.

—The Storey County Committee appointed to try and get the back rent they claim due them from the Military Commissioners of the State, was allowed Army rent from August 15 to January 1, 1887.
