—The steamer Mexico at last reports was still on the rock at Gossip Reef.
—Anschlag, the Garden Grove murderer, has been held for trial without bail.
—The Hattie Woolstein murder case, at Los Angeles, has been continued until March.
—An attempt was made to throw the afternoon train from the track near Wright's three miles below Healdsburg, Thursday, by placing ties on the rails.
—Ysidro Castro was killed Thursday, and Marcellino Soto fatally injured by the explosion of a giant-powder cartridge in the 1,000 foot level of the Almaden mine.
—Dwyer, the colored man shot by Rev. Wm. Washington, at Marysville, Wednesday night, declared he made no attempt to shoot Washington. Dwyer is not expected to live.
Plain Talk.
The Mobile, Ala., Register, Democratic to the backbone politically, blurts out its indignant prophesy as to the effect of Cleveland's free trade teachings by declaring that if a reduction of \$50,000,000 is made in the duties on imports "large bodies of home laborers must either go out of the manufacturing business and swell the increasing, overflowing number of unproductive farmers, or the price of home labor must be reduced to equalize American factories with foreign. It will be a bad day for us when we go before the American people as advocates of low wages. And yet this is precisely what we propose to do when we bear the heart of the American market to the vultures of the Old World. The party that attempts it will meet with overwhelming defeat.—not only in the elections, but very speedily in the State elections of even these Southern States."
