

**A Two-Edged Sword.**  
 Here are the facts as to wool stated in the briefest form:  
 Remove all tax from wool and its products and the surplus will be reduced \$5,000,000, or less than ten cents a head for the population. There are now, under that discrimination in favor of the foreign product, 45,000,000 sheep a degree of 9 per cent. Follow Mr. Cleveland's policy, and sheep in this country will be raised for mutton only. In the meantime \$500,000,000 is employed in the wool industry of this country, and this skill and experience of a million of growers and dealers are addressed to the development of this great interest. The mills of the country consume 350,000,000 pounds of wool annually, of which our flocks furnish 300,000,000 pounds. Take off the duty, and foreign wool will take the place of this large product, and the price of wool and its products will go up. There isn't any question about that. Free trade is a two-edged sword, and will cut deep both ways.—

**An Industrious Judge.**  
 The Reno Journal compliments Judge Bigelow for his industry. The records show that in five counties comprising his circuit, namely, Washoe, Churchill, Lander, Nye and Elko counties, he held court 204 days in 1887, 105 days in Washoe and 99 days in the other counties. During that time he heard and disposed of 159 cases, in addition to which he was called upon to transact considerable business in chambers, such as settling statements, probate orders, etc.
