

WHY HE CHANGED.

PACIFIC COAST ITEMS.

—Lillie Beck, aged ten years, was killed by a horse kicking her in the head at North Yakima, W. T., last Sunday.

—It is expected that by Autumn the Southern Pacific will be completed from Templeton to Santa Barbara.

—The great flume that is to supply San Diego with water is being built at the rate of three miles a day, and will be finished in about two months.

—Dr. Bredmeyer, the Salt Lake wife-beater, has now fasted eighteen days. He says he will starve to death if his wife drops her divorce suit.

—J. H. Timmerman, who killed William Sterling over a year ago near Goldendale, W. T., has had the sentence of death passed upon him. He is to be hanged April 6th.

—The pursuit of the Stein's Pass robbers has been very close and when last heard from the pursuing party was within a short distance of them. They were making for Sonora.

—The Tilly mine, in the Fresno foothills, which has been idle for two years, opened Monday, and as no outsider is allowed to visit the works, there is much excitement among the mining men.

—A committee of ten citizens left Fresno Monday night for San Francisco for the purpose of holding a conference with the directors of the San Joaquin Valley Railroad in regard to bringing the main line of the road to Fresno.

—The papers stolen from the pocket of Owen Gowell, the owner of the Manzanita mine at Nevada City have not been recovered. Dellapiazzi, who was arrested on the charge of having the papers, has been discharged from custody.

—When the Knights of Labor were on a strike some years ago the Brotherhood of Engineers refused to assist them. The Knights now decline to aid the engineers in the strike on the Burlington and Quincy road. It is just this sort of dissensions which will always keep the cause of labor back.

—What the Washoe Indians are good for has just been discovered. They make good shepherds. Theodore Winters has one to watch his fine band of sheep, and finds the fellow more faithful than a dog, and almost as intelligent. The Lord never made anything in vain.
