FAIR PLAY IN POLITICS.

It never pays a newspaper to make false statements in politics. The lie is very soon discovered, and when disproved it causes the newspaper originating it to lose prestige.

The voters are getting to be intelligent enough now to separate the chaff from the wheat in politics, and the dirty campaign slanders, the base reasoning, the telling of half the truth, the trickery, evasion and paltering with great public questions does not gain a vote that is not counterbalanced by a loss of at least two.

It never pays to state anything but the truth about your opponents' political meetings. Such headings as "A Dismal Fizzle," "Speaking to Empty Benches," etc., are in nine cases out of ten flat lies, and deceive no one.

The paper that gives its opponents fair play and makes correct reports of their meetings as a matter of news, will win more votes for the party than the journal indulging in misrepresentation and abuse.

Lying about the other party never injures it, but if the truth hurts it tell it fearlessly and without spitefulness, and you will win.

The frantic efforts of our Democratic contemporaries to shift the issue from free trade to the Chinese question, says the San Francisco Post, is not succeeding very well.

The Chinese question is not an issue, and if it were the voters of California could not hesitate to choose between Senator Harrison, who helped to draw the last Restriction bill that passed the Senate, and President Cleveland, by whose orders it was smothered.

The issue is between protection and free trade. It has been raised by President Cleveland, endorsed by the St. Louis Convention and boldly accepted by the Republican party. The workingmen know that they are to vote on the question whether they shall be exposed to the competition of the cheap labor of foreign countries.

The vote of New York City at the coming election will be watched with unusual interest. More than forty per cent of the people of that city are directly engaged in manufacturing. The wages paid the men and women who work in those manufactories, amount to half a million of dollars daily.

The Examiner holds that the strong prohibition platform will antagonize the Germans, and on the other hand because it isn't strong at all it will antagonize the Prohibitionists.

The Examiner will remember that the platform was not made to catch the votes of any special class of people except Americans and Republicans.
