NOT SO SOLID AS IT WAS.

Bill Arp in the Atlanta Constitution, calls a halt to an abusive campaign. He says:

"I don't see any good in the South abusing Harrison now. The South is sold for Cleveland and the battle ground is up North, and the more we abuse him here, the more it will strengthen him up there. This chronic abuse, this stereotyped slander that comes every four years, is a shame. We went to war because Lincoln was elected, and now we say he was the very best friend the South had above the line. We denounced Grant as a brute and a drunkard, and yet the great political leaders of the South praised him alive and mourned him when dead, and threw flowers upon his grave."

It will not be many years before the solidity of the South will be a thing for memory only. There is a good chance that this campaign will see the beginning of the crumbling process. There was a time when the Southerner had no thought for anything except Democracy. They voted the Democratic ticket regularly and asked no questions, because they had a dim idea that it was somehow against the interests of the North and the Union.

Since the war the Southerner has been thrown on his own resources, and astonished himself by his aptitude for developing the industries of his own State. He is more extensively engaged in manufacturing than ever before, and he depends on the Northern inventor and Northern mechanic for his machinery, and now he looks with longing eyes to the Northern States that will vote for protection to the industries which he is engaged in developing.

The people who are beginning to read and think in the South understand the situation as they never did before, and realize that the Republican party, with the development of the United States its aim and ambition, is the best friend the South ever had.

The school house will break up the solid South. When the wand of education waves there, the billows of illiteracy and Bourbon majorities are swept back as the rod of Moses walled up the waters of the Red Sea.

THE ASSESSORSHIP.

OFFICE OF ATTORNEY GEN'L CARSON, Nev. July 6, '88. John S. MAYHUGH Esq., Chin' Co. Gen. Committee.

DEAR SIR:—Your query would have received an earlier response but for my confinement of two or three weeks in bed as the result of an accident.

1. The Legislature of 1883 tried to extend the term of Assessors already then elected for two years beyond the term for which they had been in 1882 elected. This the Supreme Court decided the Legislature could not do.

But, the Court said, or meant to say, that the rest of the Act might be operative, that is. "The Legislature could make the term of Assessors four years and the term would be four years as to all those Assessors elected by the people after the passage of the Act and its going into effect, which could not be until 1886."

I therefore conclude that the Assessors elected in 1886 hold until 1890, and none are to be elected this year.

Hoping this may be satisfactory and believing it to be in accord with the Court's decision.
