CLEVELAND'S LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE.

It Reaches the National Democratic Committee and is Sent Back for Revision.

The APPEAL has information from a source that it cannot question, that Grover Cleveland sent his letter of acceptance to the National Democratic Central Committee, and that the letter was so strongly in favor of free trade, that by a unanimous vote it was sent back to Cleveland with the statement that it would defeat the party, and he was requested to revise it.

A member of the Democratic Committee is authority for this extraordinary statement, and the APPEAL's informant got it directly from him.

This fact has not yet reached the public, and will no doubt be disbelieved by many, but it is nevertheless true, and a few days more will bring the facts to light.

A Growl From Canada.

He now wishes to make it appear that he had no connection with dictating the humble terms of the treaty and assumes a bluffing attitude toward England which raises a laugh all over the United States.

How to Catch Wild Horses.

An Ohio man writes to the APPEAL that he can kill the wild stallions of the Humboldt for \$25 a head.

Joe Rayercraft says he can catch and halter-break the same horses for the same figures and deliver them to the ranchers.

Some years ago a lot of horsemen put in three weeks chasing the wild horses, but they only wore out their own horses doing so.

Rayercraft says that they did not understand how to manage them.

His plan is to take relays of horses, station men in various parts of the country and drive the band of wild horses day and night.

The idea is not to hurry them, but simply keep them moving, so that they cannot eat, drink or sleep. Whenever a stream is approached drive them across it with a rush and keep all springs guarded.

Simply jog them around in this way for a week, those who are trailing taking turns.

They should not be driven in a straight line, but in a circle as much as possible, so that the fresh men can be ready to mount and follow as soon as they come round. Presently they will be worn out and can be driven into a corral like a band of sheep.
