AT A MEETING OF THE Republican County Central Committee, held September 4, 1888, at Carson City, Nevada, it was ordered that the County Convention of 1888 consist of twenty-one members, apportioned among the various precincts as follows: Carson City, 13; Empire City, 6; It was further ordered that primary elections be held in the several precincts for the election of their respective delegates on SATURDAY, September 22, 1888; and it was further ordered that the said primaries be held and conducted upon the Crawford plan. It was further ordered that the Convention be held at Carson City on Tuesday, October 2, 1888, at 12 o'clock noon. Polls in each precinct to be open from 8 o'clock A. M. until 6 o'clock P. M. Polling place in Carson City—Curry Engine House, Inspectors of election—S. C. Wright, W. D. Torreyson, Dwight Edwards. Polling place in Empire City—Old Post-office building, Inspectors of election—J. P. Woodbury, John Barclay, and A. W. Morris. The test to be exacted of voters at said primaries is: "Are you a Republican, and will you support the Republican nominees at the ensuing election?" S. L.
