It is miles to any over-topping hills. At first (thirty years ago) water was obtained in abundance in ordinary wells at a depth of from 25 to 40 feet. Some ten years ago these wells began to dry. The owners went into them and sunk them from 10 to 30 feet deeper. In a year or two this had to be repeated. Finally the wells became from 100 to 150 feet in depth, when no one felt like following the water farther. All the time this chasing of the receding water was going on some were preaching up the sinking of artesian wells, but the old fogies stood out against it. The town began to lose population and run down at the heel generally. Then a well was started, and on the highest ground in the place. At half the depth water in abundance may be had in hundreds and thousands of places in Nevada.—Enterprise.
