

RAML UNFOURISHY.

The Silver State which a few weeks ago was against the Lottery has become disgusted with the hypocrisy of the opposition and comes out as follows:

The advocates of the lottery scheme, assert that it will be to the benefit of the State to the extent of at least \$40,000 a year, and that the only interest they have in the matter is to increase the State revenue so that the taxation can be reduced. If such is the fact, the members of the Legislature can furnish proof of it in the event of the amendment being ratified, by selling the franchise for conducting a lottery for a series of years to the individual or corporation that will pay the highest price for it.

As Nevada licenses gaming, and has done so for years without noticeable protest from those who are opposing a lottery, the objections to the measure because of its immorality will fail to convince thinking people.

A lottery is no more demoralizing than the games of chance which are licensed in Nevada, yet, for a consideration, the law which makes it a misdemeanor to advertise lotteries or sell lottery tickets, permits a dishonest gambler to swindle everybody who patronizes his game.

The Silver State has no interest except that of the general public in the lottery scheme. It has not announced that it was opposed to the lottery to have its silence purchased as is charged against some papers.

Neither does it take any stock in the objection that a lottery is more demoralizing than the games sanctioned by law, and if the Legislature can be trusted to dispose of a lottery franchise for the best interests of the State, not of a few individuals there is nothing to lose by ratifying the amendments, as it is unadulterated hypocrisy for a people who license gaming to turn up their noses at a lottery.

UNTRUE.

The anti-lottery people are spreading the story everywhere that the Lottery drawings will take place in San Francisco instead of Nevada. Why does anyone suppose that a company after having secured a franchise in one State would go in to another to have its drawings?

If that were the case, why would they need a Nevada franchise at all?

In the same connection, it is claimed that the drawings will not be in Carson, but Virginia City. Carson holds a majority of the Trustees named in the bill. They are Messrs. Kinkead, Wright, Circe and Klein, and does anyone imagine that these gentlemen will sell out their own town?

The bill also names the Capital as the place of drawing and under the auspices of the State officers.

A common query on Carson Street during the past few days is:

"Say, did you ever see these anti-lottery people spending their own money before on a proposition they were not interested in?"

"Well, I should say not," is invariably the response.

The Reason.

"Why is——, kicking so at the lottery?" "Dunno he plays faro all night, guess he wasn't consulted when they made up the company." "Oh I see."

"I understand the gamblers all favor the lottery" said a man on the street yesterday. "The gamblers do," was the response "its the men who run the sure thing snaps, who oppose it." The more one thinks over the above, the more food for reflection there appears to be in it.

The great moral movement on the Comstock, headed by Miles Finlan et. al., seems to have burst like a soap bubble.

Bono has but one thing against the lottery, and that is, that it will benefit Carson.

The Tribune fears that the Nevada Lottery company will fill its pocket at the expense of the balance of the people of Nevada. Now putting the question fairly Mr. Tribune, would you not rather see Nevada stockholders make this money than New Orleans incorporations?

Does anyone for an instance suppose that the million of circulars and anti-lottery tickets with which the State is flooded were all paid for by members of disinterested parties who were bent on purifying the public morals at their own expense.

Nevada will indeed earn the title of "Rotten Burrough" if its voters allow themselves, on election day to be slaughtered by the coin of the Louisiana Company.

Several of the leading anti-lottery people have been seen within the past year, openly peddling lottery tickets on the streets.
