**ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 84.**

**The Stockmen Interested in It.**

SECTION 1. From and after the passage of this Act it shall be unlawful for any owner of meat cattle, horses or mules, asses, goats, sheep, or other domestic cattle, or for another person to herd upon or drive such animals across or upon the lands of another for the purpose of pasture, or to graze or feed such animals upon the grass or herbage growing upon said lands of another, or when herded on the range or common to suffer or allow any such animal or animals to stray or wander upon the lands of another.

Sec. 2. Each violation of Section one of this Act is a trespass within the meaning of this Act, and the owner of said lands trespassed upon by any domestic animal or animals, when attended by or under the care of a herder, shall recover by civil action, in any court having jurisdiction thereof, the sum of twenty-five cents for each trespassing animal and for each trespass or entry of any of said animals upon his lands, and the herder may be fined upon complaint of the owner or any person having the care or control of said lands trespassed upon, in any sum not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars for each offense, or he may be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not less than ten or more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. Nothing herein contained shall affect the right of owners of stock or of any domestic animals to the free use of the common or range for their stock or domestic animals when unattended by a herder.

The artesian well bill has been amended almost out of existence in the Senate. It has not as yet been returned to the Assembly, but when it does, if the amendment seeks to kill the bill, there will be open war, for it is strongly backed there, and too much labor was spent upon it to permit of its destruction ruthlessly.—Sentinel. The water companies are all for it.

—Assemblyman Riepe made a hard and successful fight in the House last week against the Senate bill to transfer \$38,000 from the General School Fund to the University Fund. He was right; not a dollar should be taken from our School Fund for any purpose but the maintenance of the public schools.—Enterprise.
