OUR FLAG AT TAHOE.—Chas. M. Shotridge, editor of the San Jose Mercury has been spending a few weeks at Tahoe and in his paper gives an account of how an insult to our flag was resented by a committee of patriots. At "Yank's" there was a number of camping parties among which was one composed of Honorable Yard Buller and his wife from England. Their gay tents and retinues of livered servants attracted much attention. They put on so much "dog" that everything they done was immediately noticed. Thus it was noticed that an English flag was flying at the top of Mr. Yard Buller's tent and the stars and stripes were conspicuous by their absence. The attention of the Honorable gentleman was called to his neglect by a committee in a polite manner, but instead of replying courteously he declared that he was not a Russian nor a Prussian nor an American, but that he was an Englishman and that the English flag should fly over his head and none other. The committee retired for consultation, after which they again waited on the defiant individual and with Justice Kehoe of Virginia City at the head in no uncertain tones informed him that the American flag must fly above the English emblem by six o'clock or he must suffer the consequences. The Brittan swore and fumed, and said he'd be blown if the blasted flag should go up. The news of the insult spread and when six o'clock approached an immense crowd had gathered from all the resorts and neighboring camps to await the issue. There were determined men in the crowd and they showed their determination in their faces. What might have happened if Yard Buller had not weakened, cannot be told, but he weakened and at five minutes to six he appeared and put up the American flag. Then what a cheer went up from the crowd. Again and again the stary banner was cheered and patriotic songs were sung. Thus the patriotism of a devoted people was shown and the emblem which we all love and reverence was freed from insult.—Truckee Republican.

MURDERER GRIMM CAPTURED.—Sheriff Butler, of Placer county was a passenger on the East-bound passenger train this morning on his way to Bridgeport, Mono county. He was in possession of a dispatch from the Sheriff of Mono county to the effect that he had captured Edward Grimm, the slayer of Jacob Aippersbach at Fessler's ranch last June. CALIFORNIA HORSES AT WASHINGTON.—Senator Hearst is having built in the vicinity of his residence on New Hampshire avenue, near Dupont circle, Washington city, a large stable. There will be stalls in it for the accommodation of seven horses, and there will also be room for a number of carriages. The upper floor will be fitted up for the use of stablemen. It will be one of the largest private stables in the city, but it will not equal in size or in the appointments the stable built several years ago on L street, above Eighteenth street, by Senator Stanford. The latter, however, keeps a large number of horses, and his stables are generally supposed to be some public establishment by those passing by and judging merely from the great size of the buildings. The Senator when he came here, was able to rent a house that suited him as a place of residence, but he could not find a stable large enough to accommodate the number of horses which he wished to keep, and so he bought the ground and built the stable. It is believed to be the only piece of property that Senator Stanford owns in the district.




