IRRIGATION.

The United States Senate Committee on Irrigation is to hold a session in Carson on the 15th inst. State Surveyor General Jones, who is desirous of impressing the Committee with the importance of irrigation, issued a circular letter to the Board of Commissioners of the several counties, suggesting that meetings of citizens be held and persons selected to prepare and present statements of the irrigating systems of their representative localities to the Senate Committee. In accordance with this suggestion, the Board of Commissioners resolved to allow the expenses of three persons, to be selected from Paradise Valley, Winnemucca and vicinity and Lovelocks, to present the claims of their respective sections and of the whole country to the Committee. As there is no time to lose in this matter, the citizens of the several sections should meet at once, and, if they deem such a course advisable, select men to go to Carson. It is not probable that this immediate section of the Humboldt Valley will derive much benefit from the proposed system of irrigation for many years to come, it ever, as Congress will not be likely to appropriate money to build reservoirs and store water to reclaim lands owned by corporations or individuals, but the expense of sending three representative men to Carson would not be very much, and possibly some benefit to the county may result from it. A comprehensive system of water storage could be made to reclaim thousands upon thousands of acres of land in the valleys of the Humboldt and its tributaries, but to accomplish this the railroad would have to be removed from the canyons where dams for reservoirs could be built, and much land now owned by private individuals would have to be condemned for public use and purchased from its owners. —Silver State.

In speaking of the recent election at Salt Lake, the Tribune says: Is it not immense? The Central Stake of Zion, on the popular vote, has gone from fifty up to perhaps one hundred Liberal. It is a day that when we predicted its coming a few years ago, men tapped their foreheads and shook their heads most piteously. The campaign broke the spell of somnambulism, and it will never again obtain sway here. The campaign was but a preliminary skirmish, but those in it understood its significance. It was but a fight in the outer works, but the object was to obtain the right position for storming the main citadel in February, and the position was won. The enemy feel as Bragg felt when Hooker's cannon began to thunder on Lookout Mountain, and in mighty refrain the guns of Howard and Thomas in the center and of Sherman, far off on the extreme left, began to roar. The present is all right and all the omens for the future are good. No wonder men are mad with happiness. It is an epoch, a geological period; the old things have passed away. Night's candles have burned out, and jocund day Stands tiptoe on the Wasatch mountain tops.
