GIBRALTAR will make the Season of 1889, at the Ranch, Carson City, Nev., commencing March 1st, and ending September 1st. Terms, \$40 the season with the privilege of return if the mare is not with foal, or \$60 to insure a foal.

PEDIGREE.

GIBRALTAR, by Echo; Echo, by Rysdyk's Hambletonian; Echo the sire of Belle Echo, record, 2:20; Gibraltar 2:22 1/2; Victor 2:23 1/2; Senator 2:23 1/2; El Monte 2:23, Col. Hawkin 2:23 1/2; Echora 2:23 1/2; Sam Lewis 2:24 1/2 and the sire of the dams of a good many horses with records better than 2:29.

ALPHA.

ALPHA will make the Season same as Gibraltar. Term, \$25 for the Season with privilege of return or \$40 to insure a foal. You will see that ALPHA is a very fine bred horse. I am breeding all of my Gibraltar fillets to him. He is very speedy, and has shown quarters in 25 seconds and half in 1:12. He has got a record of 2:40, but he had not hit one of his ankles, and had to be stopped in his work, would have got a record in 2:15 or 2:20 sure.

1st dam Fawn, record 2:30 1/2, trial 2:22, by Marlon, son of Mambrino Chief (sire of the dams of Director 2:17, Edmond 2:17 1/2, Red Wilkes, the best son of George Wilkes, and of dam of Almont, the greatest son of Alexander's Abdallah; and his second dam Maha-ka Bell by Flaxtail (sire of Prairie Bird 4-year-old record 2:28 1/2, Empress 2:29 1/2, and sire of the dams of Shamrock 3-year-old record 2:25, the fastest in the world; Gold Leaf 2:26 1/2, Buccaneer public trial 4 years old 2:28 1/2 and Prompter record 2:33 1/2, sire of Transit 3-year-old record 2:25 1/2, Creole record 5th heat 2:31 1/2, Daisy 2:33 1/2 and fastest record in the world for a yearling pacer); 2d dam Lady Hake by John the Baptist, record of 2:45, son of Tallyho Morgan, by Sherman Morgan, he by Justin Morgan; 4th dam Fanny Fern by Tuckahoe, by Herod's Tuckahoe, by Tuckahoe; 5th dam by Leffler's Consul, son of Sweppel's Consul, by Boland's Just Consul. The dam of Perlin's Tuckahoe was Vine by Fanot's Diomed, son of Vanmeter's Diomed. Grand dam by Colonel Voss' Sidehammer son of Lee-Koo. Sherman's Consul's dam was by Arra Hooker Grand dam by imported Messenger. The dam of Privateer was Lady Nary, dam of Express 2:23 1/2 by Marlon, son of Mambrino Chief; 2d dam by John Bull of Ole dull, by old pacing Pilot sire of Pilot. Grand sire of dams of Maud S., Jay Eye See, Marlon's dam was Mary, by Sir Wallace, son of Stockholder by Tompest. Buccaneer's dam was Tinsley Maid by Flaxtail. Tinsley Maid is a full sister to Fern Leaf, dam of Gold Leaf, 3-year-old record 2:29 1/2; Shamrock, 2-year-old record 2:25 and of Lightfoot, 4-year-old record 2:22, and who in turn is dam of Pride, yearling record 2:41 1/2. Lightfoot is also dam of Pearl 2:31 1/2. Iowa Chief's dam was Topsey by Proper, son of Hill's Black Hawk by Sherman's Morgan by Justin Morgan. Green's Bashaw's dam was Belle by Peffer's Tom Thumb out of the Charles Kent mare, the dam of Rysdyk's Hambletonian and one out of One Eye by Bishop's Hambletonian son of imported Messenger, and One Eye out of Silverball by imported Messenger.

Senator Stanford in his catalogue of 1887 was breeding to 25 St. Clair brood mares and the most of his horses that have made the best records for 23 and year-olds are out of St. Clair mares, namely: Fred Crocker dam by St. Clair, two year old record 2:25 1/2; Bonito, dam by St. Clair, 2 year old record 2:24 1/2, 3 year old record 2:15 1/2; Manzanita, dam by St. Clair, 4 year old record 2:16 fastest on record.


