GIBRALTAR will make the Season of 1889, at the Ranch Carson City, Nev., commencing March 1st, and ending September 1st. Terms, \$40 the season with the privilege of return if the mare is no, with foal, or \$50 to insure a foal.

PEDIGREE.

GIBRALTAR, by Echo; Echo, by Rysdyk's Hambletonian; Echo the sire of Belle Echo, record, 2:20; Gibraltar 2:25; Victor 2:22; Senator 2:24; El Monte 2:25, Col. Hawkin 2:25; Echora 2:25; Sam Lewis 2:24 and the sire of the dams of a good many horses with records better than 2:30.

G. BRALTAR is the sire of Homestake, trial 2:15; half 1:06; Roxanna, trial 2:15; Doi a, a 4 year old mare, won three races in one week, the first and only races that she ever started in and got a record of 2:29 in the seventh heat of the last race. Gibraltar is a great producer of his colts are good size and all look alike. They are natural trotters and will have good dispositions.

ALPHA.

Buccaneer public trial at 4 years old 2:24, and Prompter record 2:33, (sire of Transit 3-year-old record 2:24, Creole record 5th heat 2:30, Daisy 2:33, and fastest record in the world for a yearling pacer); 3d dam Lady Blake by John the Baptist, record of 2:45, son of Tally Ho Morgan, by Sherman Morgan, he by Justin Morgan; 4th dam Fanny Fern by Tuckahoe, by Herod's Tuckahoe, by Tuckahoe; 5th dam by Leffler's Consul, son of Seppert's Consul, by Board's Consul. The dam of Ferris's Tuckahoe was Vine by Fanot's Blomet, son of Vanmeter's Diom d. Grand dam by Colonel Voss' sidehammer son of Lee-Boo. Sherman's Consul's dam was by Anna Hooker. Grand dam by Imported Messenger. The dam of Privateer was Lady Nelly, dam of Express 2:24, by Marion, son of Mambrino Chief; 2d dam by John Bull of Ole Bull, by old pacing Pilot sire of Pilot. Grand sire of dams of Maud's Jay Eye see. Marion's dam was Mary, by Sir Wallace, son of St. Charles holder by Temper. Buccaneer's dam was Tinsley Maid by Flaxtail. Tinsley Maid is a full sister to Fern Leaf, dam of Gold Leaf, 3-year-old record 2:24; Shamrock, 2-year-old record 2:25 and of Lightfoot, 4-year-old record 2:32, and who in turn is dam of Prude, yearling record 2:40. Lightfoot is also dam of Pearl 2:36. Iowa Chief's dam was Topsey by Propper, son of Hill's Black Hawk by Sherman's Morgan; 2d dam by John Morgan. Green's Bashaw's dam was Belle by Peffer's Tom Thumb out of the Char-ss Kent mare, the dam of Rysdyk's Hambletonian and she out of One Eye by Herod's Hambletonian son of Imported Messenger, and one Eye out of Silverball by Imported Messenger.
