**The State Loses.**

As the APPEAL, and in fact everybody else, predicted some time ago, the State has lost its law suit with Lyon county.

What legal grounds the State had for the peculiar position it took has not been developed.

The trials in the Justice and the District Court failed to throw any light on the subject.

The Board throughout seems to have been governed by an extraordinary lack of common business sense.

Its members seemed to be filled with the idea that it is simply their business to hunt for technicalities and petty quibbles, that they may prevent money being removed from the State Treasury. They regard the State Treasury, not as a financial medium for conducting the authorized business of the State, but as a sort of sacred trust from which not a dime shall be taken if they can possibly help it.

This is altogether an unbusiness-like and juvenile view to take of the matter and disgusts nine tenths of the taxpayers.

This hair splitting economy is really a foolish extravagance and Messrs. Stevenson, Alexander and Dormer must realize by this time that their posing as Treasury watch dogs has in no way enhanced their reputations as public officers.

This is the second time the legal advice of Attorney General Alexander has been coppered by the courts.

The other instance was when he advised the Board not to advertise the Constitutional Amendments.

The Supreme Court pronounced the amendments null and void and cost the State a large sum.

It will thus be seen that any attempts on the part of the Board to pose as a Treasury watch dog will only be regarded as ridiculous and unsatisfactory by the public.

**Water for Jacks Valley.**

Some of the Jacks Valley ranchers talk of storing water up near the summit of the sierras. On the north fork of the main canyon west of the Valley is situated a springy basin about 200 feet wide and half mile long. Some years ago the woodmen made a dam of plank with a fill at each end and stored water to a depth of about five feet. It is said that but little labor would be required to repair this dam so that water could be stored to even a greater depth. One great advantage of the basin is that instead of the water seeping out, the springs in the bottom not only prevent waste, but will doubtless replace the loss by evaporation. As the reservoir is situated near the regular water course there will be no expense or waste in conducting the water to the fields below.—Courier.

**A Farcical Verdict.**
