THE SILVER DEMAND.

There is an unprecedented demand for silver and silver certificates, and the last month's coinage of silver was immediately placed in circulation. The New York banks have lately presented \$1,000,000 gold certificates at the Treasury to exchange for silver certificates. And yet the cry of the banks is that silver is a drug on the market and a repudiated coin. There is no better time to act, than the present; and we ask, why does not Congress stop filibustering over rules and elections and pass a free coinage bill? We ask why? The cause is not far off. Many of the members are undecided and have their hands thrust back of them, waiting to be convinced by Wall street. There is no use for the present Congress to plead that they have not the majority, as the Nevada Congressmen admit there is a good majority in both Houses, who favor the white metal. We say act and stop considering. We have had enough speeches and bills on silver; what we want now; what the whole country needs, is more silver—then vote and end the doubt, stop the issue, and win a victorious battle for the cause of silver.—Silver State.

JEKYLL AND HYDE OUT DONE.

A Sanctimonious Chicagoan and His Lascivious Conspiracies.

Chicago, March 7.—The Times devotes six columns this morning to exposing Rev. C. B. Cahusac, well known in philanthropic circles of this city, connected with the High Church Episcopalians, missionaries, Women's Christian Temperance Union and even with the police officials. He has passed as a zealous worker and God-fearing man, a missionary seeking to reclaim misguided and fallen girls from the paths of crime and vice.

Cahusac has been leading a Jekyll-Hyde existence. As Cahusac he was a model clergyman. As Dr. Towner his alleged object was to employ young girls, lure them into disreputable resorts, deliberately ruin them, cast them off and seek more converts. A Times female reporter, getting a clue, answered his advertisements and letters, met him at the commercial Hotel, where he made vile propositions, under promise of marriage which she seemingly acquiesced in. She followed up the clues and exposed an extraordinary career of infamy, many women testifying as to his character as a libertine. The whole expose has caused a great sensation in religious and missionary circles, in which his standing has been very high. In his assumption of personalities he has seen the novelist Stevenson one better, for whilst carrying on the dual career of Jekyll (Cahusac) and Hyde (Towner) at night, alternating as a man of God and a gross libertine, he had worked for Kinsley, the famous Chicago caterer, in the day time under a third name.
