A SUIT DISMISSED.—The suit commenced by George Hearst, in San Francisco, against Frank G. Newlands, as Trustee of William Sharon, deceased, to declare that he is entitled to an undivided one-fifth interest of the Rancho Rincon de Los Salinas y Potrero Viego, known as Bayview Park, in this county, was ordered off the calendar by Judge Hoge Tuesday.

The White Pine News learns that the suit of the Joanna and other mines in that district, have not been compromised, but will come up for trial either at Ely or Carson during next April.

WHERE IS ALEXANDER?

The State Still Postpone Action on the Election Bills.

Yesterday Governor Stevenson and Secretary of State Dorman met as a quorum of the Board of Capitol Commissioners to once more wrestle with a batch of special election bills.

District Attorney Torreyson was there to represent Ormsby county and notified the Board that the bills presented by him had been allowed by the County Commissioners, on two separate occasions and vouched for as correct.

The Governor scanned the bills once and the Secretary of State took a look at them. The bill of the APPEAL had been cut down six squares because the Board did not consider that the last end of it was unauthorized.

The Governor also stated that there was nothing to show that the advertising had ever been authorized by the Board of County Commissioners.

Mr. Torreyson called his attention to the fact that the Board had certified that the bills were correct.

The Governor then scrutinized the bills again and discovered that the Clerk's seal was not there. Mr. Torreyson at once sent over and Mr. Doane hit it with the county seal, throwing his entire weight on it. The Governor then called for a certified copy of the the Commissioners' minutes. Mr. Doane was then sent for and he brought over the minutes, all written out in due form.

The Governor then carefully read the clause authorizing the advertisement, and found it to be correct in every particular, ticket and everything included.

His excellency then inquired for the whereabouts of John Alexander, the legal adviser of the State. Several parties present believed him to be in San Francisco where he had been taking in the strains of the Patti opera. Mr. Torreyson notified the State that if the claims were not paid this month, he should begin suit against the State in behalf of Ormsby county. Yesterday Auditor McCabe drew warrants for all balances due on the Special Election over a year ago.

The Black Hussar Band.


