NOTICE TO CLAIMANTS OF WATER RIGHTS ON CARSON RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

M. of said day, at the Court room of said Court, at Carson City, Nevada, is hereby appointed as the time and place for commencing to hear and take evidence in such adjudication, at which time and place any person, association or corporation interested in Carson River or its tributaries, either as owner or consumer of water therefrom, or having a claim of a water right therein, whether named in said petition and application or not, may appear and offer evidence in support of or against any claims of priority of appropriation of water made by means of any dam, ditch, canal or reservoir, or by any enlargement or extension thereof, in said district and on said river and tributaries, and the Court will consider all such evidence.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of said Court give such public notice thereof as is by law required.
