PROPOSALS FOR SEWERS!

TO BE LAID IN CARSON CITY, NEVADA.

The Board of Trustees of Carson City Nev., will receive proposals for the building of about Thirty Thousand (30,000) feet of Vitrified Ironstone Sewer as follows:

- 1. For the entire work including eleven (11) Flush Tanks. 2. For furnishing the pipe and fittings F. O. B. Carson City Nevada, breakage at bidders risk. 3. For the excavation of trenches in the streets of said city and filling up the same after the pipe is laid. 4. For the laying of said pipe and fittings and furnishing cement. 5. For the furnishing of about Thirty-five (35) Bbls No. 1, Portland cement, F. O. B. cars Carson City, Nev. 6. For the supplying an erection of Eleven Flush Tanks approved pattern, ten having a discharging capacity of twenty-seven (27) cubic feet and one having a discharging capacity of fifty-nine cubic feet, the basins to be built of selected hard burned brick laid in cement, mortar, water proof. All material to be supplied and worked performed in accordance with the plans and specifications to be seen at the office of the City Clerk, Carson City Nevada and under the supervision of a Civil Engineer and Superintendent appointed by the Board of Trustees.

Proposals will be received for any or all of the material or work to be furnished or performed. Each bid for entire work must be accompanied by a certified check for five-hundred (\$500) dollars. Each bid for supplying material, excavation, or other work must be accompanied by a certified check for Three hundred (\$300) dollars, which on rejection of any proposed bid will be returned to the bidder.
