LAKE TAHOE.

Von Schmidt Defends His Rights.

EDITOR Bulletin: The item published in your paper of the 7th, containing a protest from the people of Reno, Nev., against the Lake Tahoe and San Francisco Water Works from taking water from Lake Tahoe for the supply for the city of San Francisco or any town or city on the line of works, just at this time, is very plain whence it originates.

The papers just at this time give accounts of the great freshets along the Truckee river. Notwithstanding the gates of the Lake Tahoe Water Company's dam, at the outlet of the lake are closed, the entire lake will be raised six feet before it runs over the waste weir. Now all the water our company propose to draw from this surface of water is less than a foot a year.

It has also been stated, over and over again, that for four months of the year while the snow is melting, the company have all the water [they want?] on the west side of the mountains near Soda Springs on the South Fork of the North Fork of the American River. Therefore the Lake Tahoe and San Francisco Water Works will draw for only eight months from Lake Tahoe.

The people along the Truckee will always have water, and I will assure them that the company will, if necessary, at a very dry season, cut a channel from the company's second dam into the lake and lower it ten to fifteen feet if necessary. So far this portion of the case is explained.

We all know that the greater part of Lake Tahoe (three quarters) lies within the State of California, nine-tenths of the watershed is also in this State. The Truckee river runs over thirty miles in this State before it enters Nevada, thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction into Pyramid lake, where it becomes alkalied and is not fit for use.

Now is it possible that a city of a population of 350,000 alone, as San Francisco is today, shall be deprived of a mountain supply, within her own State, because a water company, now supplying the city, objects; or that a few men in the Sagebrush State want to see the water run to waste out of spite? It does not appear that a few should stop a work that will benefit the whole country through which the water will be brought when we consider that the entire population of the State of Nevada is only 40,000—nor do they all live on the Truckee river at Reno.

When those people speak of their rights, we want our rights and nothing more.

The Lake Tahoe and San Francisco Water Works have the first right. And I herewith give our title. If anyone has a better, let him come forward or forever after hold his peace.

TITLE.

The company's title and ownership to the waters, and right-of-way, is acquired and confirmed under and by virtue of the incorporation laws of the State of California, and by an Act of Congress of the United States, passed July 26, 1866, entitled "An Act granting the right-of-way to ditch and canal owners, over the public lands, and for other purposes." At the second dam heretofore referred to, the company own by location and purchase from the University of the State of California, a patent to the southwest quarter of section 34, township 16 N., range 16 E., Mount Diablo base and meridian. This location embraces the bed of the Truckee river for the distance of one quarter mile.

Sections 2,338 and 2,340 affirm the water right acquired under the Act of 26th July, 1866—United States Revised Statutes, enacted by Congress, 22d day of June, 1874, page 432.

Section 2,338. Whenever, by priority of possession, rights to the use of water for mining, agricultural, manufacturing or other purposes have vested and accrued, and the same are recognized and acknowledged by the local customs

courts, the possessors and owners of said vested rights shall be maintained and protected in the same, and the right of way for the construction of ditches and canals for the purposes herein specified is acknowledged and confirmed; but whenever any person in the construction of any ditch or canal, injures or damages the possession of any settler on the public domain, the party committing such injury shall be liable to the party injured for such injury or damage.

Section 2,340 All patents granted, or pre-emption or homestead allowed, shall be subject to any vested and accrued water right or rights to ditches and reservoirs used in connection with such water rights as may have been acquired under or recognized by the preceding section.

The Lake Tahoe and San Francisco Water Works are acting in good faith. They want to have ever, city and town from Auburn to San Francisco to own its own water-works. We are for the people, and not corporations that charge more for water than it costs a family to buy bread.
