

THE SURVEYOR GENERAL

Hon. Geo. F. Turrin, under the graphic orders from Louis F. Graf, Commissioner of the General Land Office at Washington, D. C., to enter at once upon his duties as Surveyor General of Nevada, assumes his position as such to-day.

While welcoming the coming, it may not be out of place to speak of the parting guest. Gen. Irish assumed the duties of Surveyor General of the General Land Office under peculiar circumstances.

G. n. Irish however had an honest record combined with ability and experience and he soon became regarded in this community, not as an "Iowa carpet bagger," but a citizen who benefitted the State from the moment he located here.

He won the respect of all whom he came in contact, irrespective of party and in spite of his being a Democrat appointed by Cleveland the leading Republicans of the State were in full accord with him and his work.

He was able and honest and would have never been called to step down but for the fact that his party is not at present in the majority.

He will settle permanently in Reno and follow his old profession as surveyor.

COAST NEWS.

Robert Pinkey, a saloon-keeper, was drowned in Stockton Channel Sunday.

Calvin B. Gardiner, a popular dentist at Spokane Falls, and F. M. Tull, the son of a wealthy merchant of that city, were swept over the falls Sunday and drowned.

Six American prospectors ran into a band of eighteen Apaches on the eastern slope of the Sierra Madres, in Sonora, Mexico, and had a running fight for fifteen miles, and only escaped on account of the fleetness of their horses.

In an accident on the Utah and Northern Railroad, near Dillon, Mont., Saturday, W. C. Curtis, a brakeman, was killed. The cars were badly wrecked and 500 sheep were killed outright and 200 or 300 more crippled and subsequently killed by butchers.

There is considerable talk in San Francisco about breaking the rule of Boss Buckley by a general revolt all along the line. There is no likelihood of this ever taking place as there is nobody in the democratic party of California capable of taking his place.

The latest from Washington is that a compromise silver bill has been agreed on, by which the Secretary of the Treasury is compelled to order the coinage of five million per month. This bill is reported as acceptable to the silver men and the President has agreed to sign it.

There is a foreign element in the mines of Lackawanna, Luzerne and Carbon counties, Penn., which refuses to give any information to the census enumerators, and whose members are known only by numbers, convict fashion. This is bringing American labor down to a pretty low scale.
