Of the People on

**SATURDAY, AUG. 16, 1890.**

For the purpose of electing Delegates to the said State Convention, the Primary Elections to be carried out in compliance with the laws of this State and the instructions of this Committee.

The following list will be required of each and every voter at the said Primary Elections: "I am a citizen of this State and will support the nominees of the Republican party."

The following Resolutions were unanimously adopted:

Resolved, That this committee reaffirms the State and National Republican platform of 1888, including the declaration that "the Republican party is in favor of the use of both gold and silver as money" and that "condemnation of all efforts to demonetize silver."

Resolved, That the persistent neglect of Secretary Wilson to increase the coinage of silver to the maximum of four hundred millions per month, coupled with his attempt to influence Congress to limit the coinage of pure silver demonetization, is a shameful violation of the silver plank of the National Republican platform, and an act which is a direct injury to the miners, farmers and workers of the land, and an act of gross perfidy that should call for his removal from the office of an Administration which is pledged to help and not to hinder the remaining legislation of silver.

Resolved, That the Republican party of this State is in favor of free and unlimited coinage of both gold and silver; that it is in favor of this principle as a tenet of party faith and a test of party allegiance; that it will permit of no abandonment or modification of this doctrine; that let who ever will prove recalcitrant to the principle of a standard of party faith and standard of party allegiance, and let him or her be expelled from the ranks of the party.

Resolved, That the repeal of the iniquitous inter-legal law of 1873 by which silver was demonetized, and which since the establishment of free and unlimited coinage as the law of the United States of America, to join in electing delegates to a Republican State Convention.
