

TIMBER LAND THREATENED.

The big tree timber land is about to be pounced upon by the lumber men and the threatened destruction will deprive California of one of the grandest forests on the face of the earth.

In 1885, December 24th, Land Commissioner Sparks withdrew from entry, 8 townships in Tulare county. The cause governing such action was the supposed fraudulent survey of the land in question, but the Commissioner subsequently decided to restore a part of it in advance of official investigation, the suspension only to continue until the correct character of the survey is known.

The one soon to be opened for filing, if nothing is done to prevent it, consists of from 1,000 to 4,000 acres, variously estimated, of the finest growth of sequoia gigantea, with a good sprinkling of pines (Lambertina.)

It is worth pasting in your hat to be referred to in a year from now: Aggregate of interest-bearing debt, exclusive of United States bonds issued to Pacific railroads, \$700,799,360; debt of which interest ceased since maturity, \$1,083,135; aggregate of debt bearing no interest, including national bank bonds deposited in Treasury under act of July 14, 1890, \$407,056,533; aggregate of certificates offset by cash in Treasury, \$474,073,040; aggregate of debt, including certificates, July 31, 1890, \$1,584,532,068. Total cash in Treasury, \$708,142,956. Debt, less cash in Treasury July 31, 1790, \$876,389,113. Debt less cash in Treasury June 30, 1890, \$876,784,370. Net decrease of the debt during the month, \$395,257.
